Harvey Vineyard For Sheriff.

While I have been a peace officer for many years, occupying the position of marshal of Eagle Lake and deputy sheriff, my operations as such have been confined to the eastern part of our county, and, therefore, there are many of you who probably have no knowledge of my work as a peace officer. I, therefore, desire to say that, I was marshal of Eagle Lake for five years, tax collector and assessor for five years, and collected each year as much as \$7,544.42, thus handling during my five years of incumbency, a large amount of money, and my books were approved as correct by the Mayor, and whose duty it was to do so; thus showing my strict attention to the business in hand. I was deputy sheriff under W. E. Bridge for several years, and during that time, ran down many criminals, some of them being of the worst type. Among them were the only three criminals who were legally convicted and hanged for the last twenty years in Colorado County, to wit:

Henry Holmes, who murdered a Mexican man and child, and who was hanged December, 1905.
Walter Bates, who in a case of robbery, by the use of a deadly weapon, murdered and left for dead, a German man and wife, named Cowley, and who was hanged December, 1906.

John Armstrong, who murdered his wife, and was hanged in 1906. As to my fitness for the position of sheriff, I refer to every man in Eagle Lake, whether he be friendly to me or not. Therefore, confidently pointing to my past record, as a peace officer, I respectfully ask the support of the voters of Colorado County, assuring you, if elected, to do my duty as a peace officer, of the whole county, as well as I have done it in the minor positions, which I have heretofore filled. 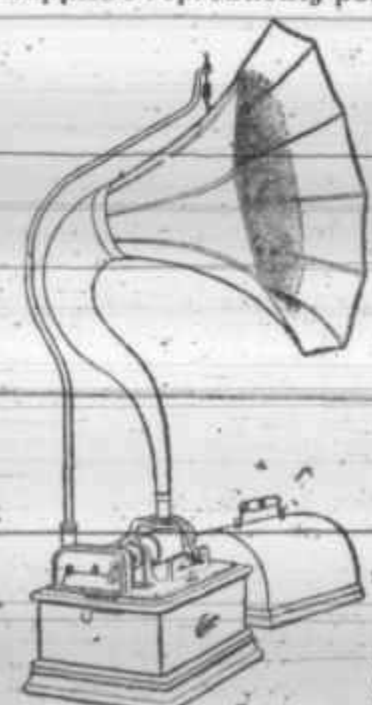
