The speaker was introduced by Ex-Mayor W. S. Strickland. Mr. McDonald handled his many subjects in a masterly manner and received much applause. He gave briefly a history of Governor Colquitt, following him from the time of his birth, school days and newspaper work and official life, and wound up by asking if his hearers did not think a man so raised should not be allowed to serve the full term as Governor that had been accorded to all who had preceded him since the war.

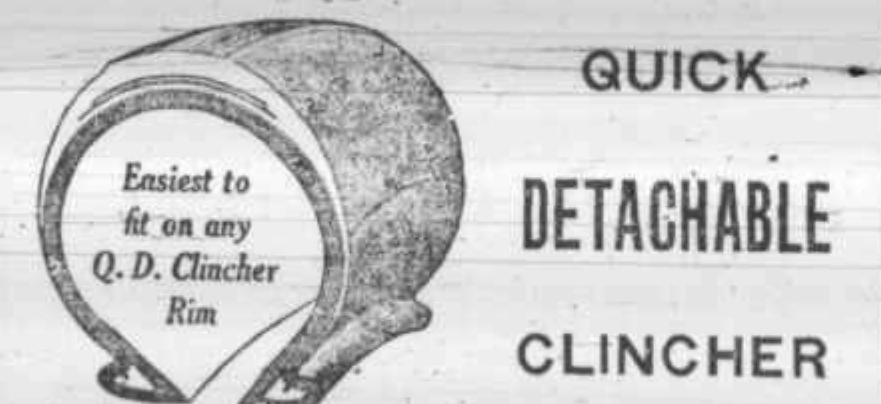

COUNTY CROP CONDITIONS

Reports Show That Crops of All Kinds in Colorado County Are Promising Large Yields.

The following report as to crop conditions in Colorado county, is taken from Tuesday's Galveston News:

Ginned 1911, 18,896 bales. Weimar—Cotton acreage 90; condition 90. Corn acreage 100; condition 100. Irish potato acreage 100. Feedstuff, such as prairie hay, Johnson grass and sorghum, conditions 90.

Oakland—Cotton acreage 100; condition 100. Corn acreage 100; condition 100. The corn and cotton crops here are probably one week later than last year, but conditions are equally as good. The cotton is blooming abundantly and the boll weevil is doing little damage. The corn crop is also doing well. Late rains have insured a splendid yield.

Columbus—Cotton acreage 90; conditions 100. Corn acreage 100; condition 120. Irish potato acreage 200; condition 100; yielding 75 bushels per acre. Cotton acreage and condition in some localities suffering from ravages of grasshoppers. They are much worse this year than in many years past, some say since the '80s.

Eagle Lake—Cotton crop of this section is "good up, to this time; corn is also good, but is needing another good rain now to insure a bumper yield. Rice is looking well and the fields are being amply supplied with water. There were about 500 cars of potatoes shipped out of here this season, which are about three or four hundred cars short of what was predicted.
