Some Fruits of Baileyism.

Reviewing his record in the U. S. senate, Senator Bailey, in his address at Indian Gap, three years ago, with reference to his attitude on the tariff question stated that he voted for a duty on wood pulp, from which blank paper is made. "Because," he inquired of his audience, "How many newspapers are there in this country?" A voice: "Four." "Well, you see, out of a country containing some 20,000 people only four would be benefited by free wood pulp." And some people threw their hats into the air and screamed themselves "black in the face." "Hurrah for Bailey!" This writer stood dumbfounded, but was forcibly reminded of that wonderful prayer of the Savior: "Forgive them Lord, for they know not what they do." On our desk this week we have here for the inspection of all, a number of letters from different paper manufacturers and dealers of whom we purchase blank paper, and they read like this:

All paper manufacturers of United States and Canada have advanced their prices from 10 to 20 per cent. This compels us to make the following change in our price list to take effect May 20th. We have been advised that book and other papers have also advanced and will inform you later to what extent."

This raise in the price of blank paper will necessarily compel a raise in the subscription price of all newspapers, and also the price of printed stationery, books and all kinds of commercial printing must be increased or the quality reduced, or else many will wind up in the hands of the sheriff and be held for debt. Many erst-while splendid publications will

have to reduce their sheets to mere nothing, or else raise the price of subscription and advertising. The school children will be compelled to pay more for their books, and so on down through all the avenues of trade where any kind of paper is used, from the patent medicine nostrums to Sunday school and church literature, the price must be increased, and the people pay the freight while the big water trust waxes extremely rich. "Four people only in Hamilton county would be benefited should I vote for the people instead of the big interests—Joe Bailey, Oh, you great big beautiful—Jackass!"—Hamilton Record.

Stock Law Election.

In Chambers: Whereas, upon the petition of the citizens of Justice Precinct No. 8 of Colorado County, the Honorable Commissioners' Court on the 14th, day of May, 1912, made and entered an order for an election to be held for the purpose of determining whether or not horses, mules, jacks, jennets, and cattle shall be permitted to run at large within said Justice Precinct, which said precinct or subdivision is more fully described by metes and bounds as follows, to-wit:

Beginning on the East bank of the Colorado River at the North West corner of the G. S. Snider League, being the South West corner of Justice Precinct No. 7; thence down the Colorado River with its meanderings to the Wharton County line; thence North Easterly with the line between Wharton and Colorado Counties to the San Bernado River, being the Austin County line; thence up the San Bernado River with its meanderings to the South East corner of H. & T. C. R. Co.'s Survey No. 3, being the South East corner of Justice Precinct No. 6; thence West with the South lines of the said H. & T. C. R. Co.'s Survey No. 3 and M. A. Posey Survey to the West corner of the Posey Survey; thence South-west with the line of the German Immigration Co.'s Survey to its South corner; thence North West with the line of the George Brune Survey to its North corner; thence South West with the line of the Adam Becker survey to its South corner; thence North West with the line of the Columbus Tap R. R. Co.'s Survey No. 663 to its North corner; thence South West with the line of the Columbus Tap R. R. Co.'s Survey No. 663 to its West corner; thence North West with the line of the P. K. Bartleson League to its North corner; thence South West with the North West lines of the said

Bartleson League and the Martin D. Ramsey Surveys to the track of the G. H. & S. A. R. R. Co.; thence North West with the G. H. & S. A. R. R. Co.'s track to the North corner of the G. S. Snider League; thence South West with the lines of the Snider and R. Alley League to the place of beginning.

Therefore, pursuant to the order of the Honorable Commissioners' Court, and by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and Laws of the State of Texas; it is hereby ordered that an election of the freeholders who are also qualified voters, residing within said Justice Precinct No. 8, shall be held in accordance with law on Saturday the 27th, day of July A. D. 1912, and the polls for said election shall be opened at the place within said precinct, in the City of Eagle Lake, within said Justice Precinct, and all voters at said election desiring to prevent the animals designated in this order from running at large within the said subdivision shall place upon their ballots the words "For the stock law," and those in favor of allowing such animals to run at large shall place upon their ballots the words "Against the stock law."

It is further ordered that A. J. Wirtz be appointed Presiding Officer of said election and W. Y. Westmoreland, Robert E. Walker and H. P. Hahn be appointed Judges, who, collectively shall constitute the managers of said election, and they are hereby fully authorized, empowered and directed to appoint their clerks, and to hold said election and make return thereof as the law provides.

It is further ordered that public notice of said election shall be given by the publication of this order in the Weimar Mercury, a newspaper published in Colorado County, for at least thirty days before the day of election.

In testimony whereof, I hereunto place my official signature, together with the seal of my office, at Columbus, Texas, this 24th day of June, A. D. 1912.

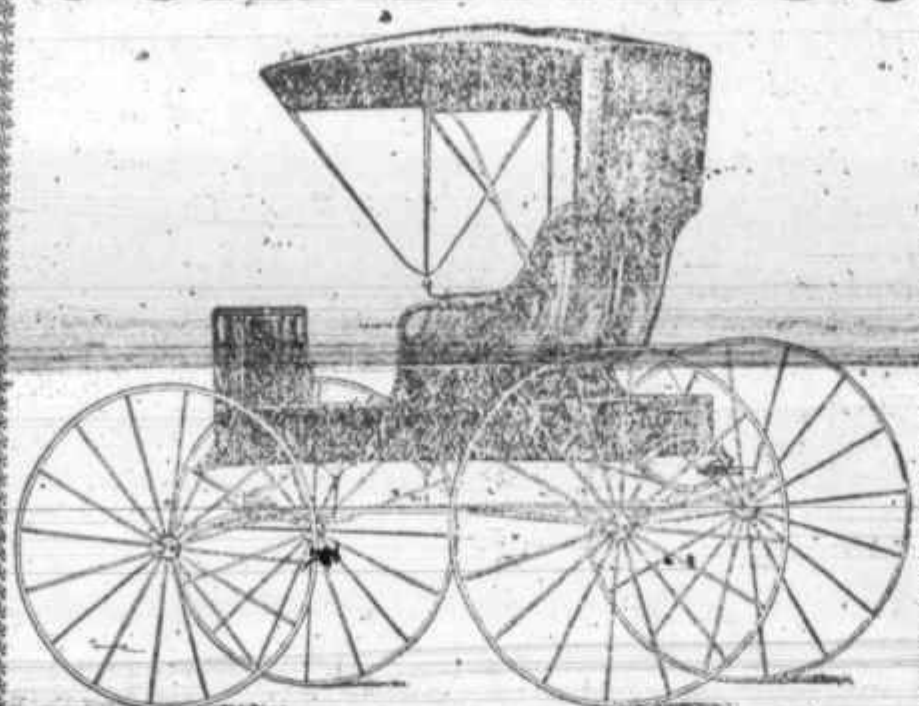

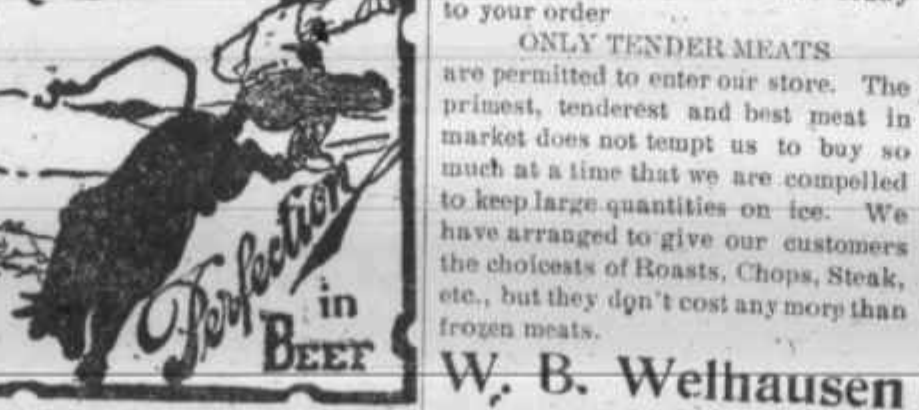
