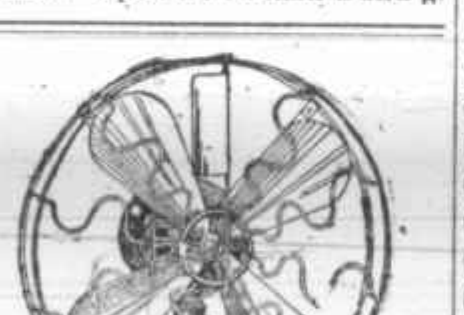

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SEWERAGE BADLY NEEDED
Eagle Lake is Badly in Need of a First Class Sewerage System.

That a sewerage system would be of advantage to every person in Eagle Lake no one denies, and that it would prove even more advantageous to the poorer people of the city, people who have only small yards surrounding their homes, than to the wealthier class who have large enclosures around their homes, is proved by the fact that the city council has instructed the city engineer to prepare plans for a sewerage system.

Notwithstanding the running of bath water into the street ditches. People who have just small yards around their home have no other place to run such water, and it is absolutely essential that people bathe—especially during such hot weather as we are now experiencing. This paper stands for everything pertaining to progress of this town or community and it is agitating a sewerage system because it believes the people—the poor people as well as those more fortunately situated—need a sewerage system just a little bit worse than they need anything else.

The city marshal has been ordered by the city council to enforce the ordinance prohibiting the running of bath water, etc., into the street ditches. This again calls forcibly to mind the fact that Eagle Lake needs a sewerage system and our town needs it badly. People who have large enclosures surrounding their homes have a place to run their waste waters, but people who have only small yards and whose homes are situated near the streets realize just how badly Eagle Lake does need a sewerage system.

No town in South Texas has prospered and grown in such substantial improvements in the past few years than Eagle Lake. The opportunity is now at our door for still further developments. If the progressive citizens will get out and work and carry the stock law election on the 27th of this month, our town will forge to the front. People will take an interest in beautifying their yards and the streets and cement sidewalks will be built. Many who are opposed to the stock law are working hard to defeat it. What are you doing to carry it?

The city of Eagle Lake has purchased a street sprinkler from the Studebaker Company for the city's use at a cost of \$200. Mr. G. E. Boothe has been appointed by the council as driver.

Mayor P. P. Putney, acting for the city, has contracted with Geo. W. Keith for the moving of the fire station, which is now near the livery stable, to the Dr. Norris lot near the Aransas Pass depot.
