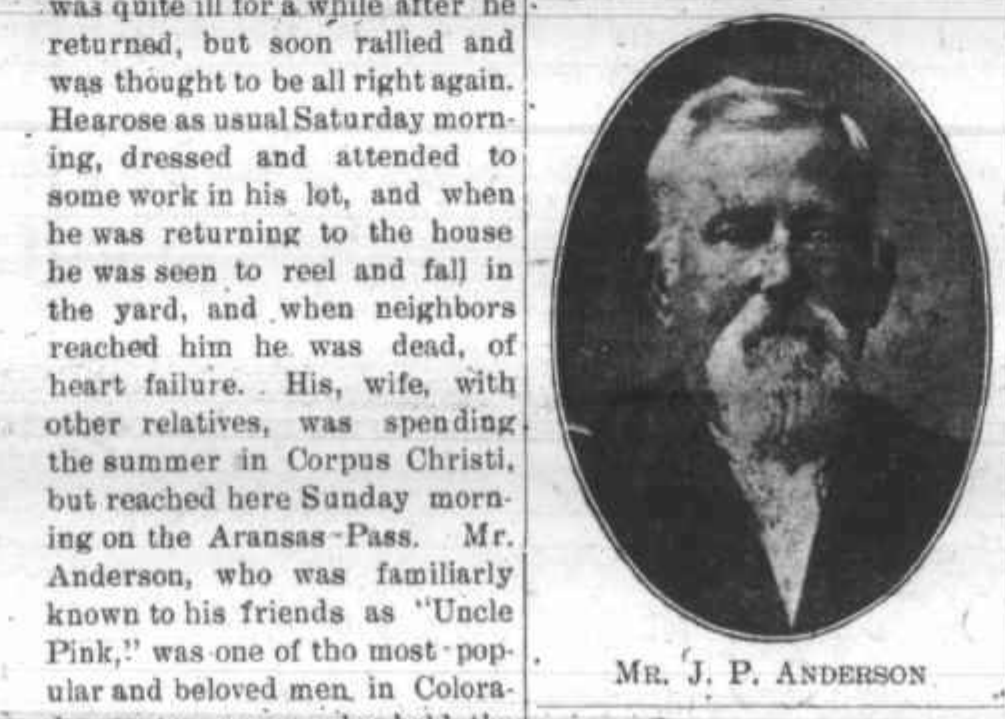

"UNCLE PINK" ANDERSON DIED SUDDENLY SATURDAY MORNING.

Eagle Lake Has Lost One of Its Best Citizens. This Community a Grand Old Man—Another Old Soldier Has Answered The Last Roll Call.

A mantle of sorrow was cast over this city and community when it was learned on last Saturday morning that Mr. J. P. Anderson had died suddenly. He had been out to his farm the evening previous and while walking over the fields examining the cotton crop, he became overheated, and was quite ill for a while after he returned, but soon rallied and was thought to be all right again. Hearose as usual Saturday morning, dressed and attended to some work in his lot, and when he was returning to the house he was seen to reel and fall in the yard, and when neighbors reached him he was dead, of heart failure. His wife, with other relatives, was spending the summer in Corpus Christi, but reached here Sunday morning on the Aransas-Pass. Mr. Anderson, who was familiarly known to his friends as "Uncle Pink," was one of the most popular and beloved men in Colorado county—a man who held the respect and enjoyed the friendship of every man, woman and child in this community. He was a man whose truthfulness was unquestioned—whose word was as good as his bond. Eagle Lake has lost one of its best citizens, and in his death another old Confederate soldier has answered the last roll call. "Uncle Pink's" familiar form will be missed on our streets—more so because he was a man welcomed in every place of business in the city. He was in a sense a privileged character, for he always found a welcome in the private office of every business concern in Eagle Lake. All the people liked him, and were glad to have him around. Mr. Anderson was a grand old man. A man who believed in not saying all the nice things after you were dead, but while you lived. This he carried out to the letter, and he always had a good word or a compliment for everybody. If he liked you he did not hide it—he let you know it. He was a man plain spoken, of the old true Southern type. It was not a puzzle to determine how "Uncle Pink" stood on any question. He took the side he believed to be right, and he didn't care who knew how he stood on anything.

lived here since that time. All the prairie land was lying idle at that time, the farms being only on the river. Mr. Anderson put in the first prairie land farm between here and the Colorado river.

A few years ago this paper printed a biography of Mr. Anderson's life, for which he more than once thanked us for the nice things we said about him in it. We are glad we said them while he lived to read them and to appreciate them. From this article is taken the following: "The leaf worm, Mr. Anderson says made its first appearance in this country in 1873 and that year the crop was almost destroyed by the pest. In the following year he commenced poisoning with Paris green, and the crop of '74 was a bumper one. Mr. Anderson says that deer were so plentiful in those days that hunters would kill only the biggest and fattest of the bucks. Deer, he says, went in droves and more of them could be seen on the prairies around Eagle Lake than you can see cattle now. Mr. Anderson says running wild turkey sport on horseback was great sport, and that he has killed countless numbers of prairie chickens right where the business portion of Eagle Lake now stands. Quail were seldom hunted in those days, and in his opinion, there are more quail today than there were then. The prairies were covered with thousands and thousands of wolves."

Mr. Anderson was converted and joined the Baptist church here last summer during Evangelist Ham's revival meeting. He was one of the oldest and most beloved members of the local Masonic lodge. He was buried Sunday afternoon in the Masonic cemetery with Masonic ceremonies. He leaves a wife
