Proclamation of Result of Stock Law Election.

Whereas, in obedience to an order of the Honorable Commissioners' Court of Colorado County, Texas made and entered on the 14th day of May, A. D. 1912, and of an order of the County Judge of Colorado County, made in pursuance thereof on the 24th day of June, A. D. 1912, an election of the qualified voters who are also free-holders residing within the subdivision of said county hereinafter described, was held at Eagle Lake, within said subdivision, on Saturday, the 27th day of July, A. D. 1912, for the purpose of determining whether or not horses, mules, jacks, jennets and cattle shall be permitted to run at large within said subdivision, and

Whereas, the returns of said election were duly made as provided by law, which said returns were, by the undersigned authority, on the 5th day of August, A. D. 1912, in the presence of John Hastedt, County Clerk, and A. A. Gregory, Justice of the Peace in and for Precinct No. 1, of Colorado County, Texas, opened, tabulated and counted as the law provides, the result of said election as shown by said returns being as follows:

Total number of votes polled 242. For the Stock Law Received 194 votes. Against the Stock Law Received 105 votes.

Now, therefore in consideration of the premises, and by virtue of authority of the constitution and laws of the state of Texas, I, J. J. Mansfield, County Judge of Colorado County, Texas, do hereby order and proclaim that from and after thirty

days from the date hereof it shall be unlawful for any person to permit horses, mules, jacks, jennets and cattle to run at large within Justice Precinct No. 8, Colorado County, Texas, which is described by metes and bounds as follows to-wit:

Beginning on the East bank of Colorado River at the North West corner of the G. S. Snider League, being the South West corner of Justice Precinct No. 7; thence down the Colorado River with its meanderings to the Wharton County line; thence North Easterly with the line between Wharton and Colorado Counties to the San Bernardo River—being the Austin County line; thence up the San Bernardo River with its meanderings to the South East corner of H. & T. C. R. R. Co. Survey No. 3—being the South East corner of Justice Precinct No. 6; thence

West with the South lines of the said H. & T. C. R. R. Co's. Survey No. 3, and the M. A. Posey Survey to the West corner of the Posey Survey; thence South West with the line of the German Emigration Co's. Survey to its South corner; thence North West with the line of the George Brune Survey to its North corner; thence South West with the line of the Adam Becker Survey to its South corner; thence North West with the line of the Columbus Tap R. R. Co's. Survey No. 663 to its North corner; thence South West with the line of the Columbus Tap R. R. Co's. Survey No. 663 to its West corner; thence North West with the line of the P. K. Bartleson League to its North corner; thence South West with the North West lines of the said Bartleson League and the Martin D. Ramsey Surveys to the track of the G. H. & S. A. R. R. Co., thence North West with the G. H. & S. A. R. R. Co.'s track to the North corner of the G. S. Snider League; thence South West with the lines of the Snider and R. Alley League to the place of beginning.

New Way to Make Apple Dumplings

Served With Hard Sauce or Cream and Sugar

Here is a new way to make apple dumplings that will surely please every housewife, for it is not necessary to have whole apples, and the juice cannot run out and burn as with apple dumplings where the apple is placed in the center and the dough turned up around it. The biscuit part forms a crispy shell that holds the apples and juice.



K C Apple Dumplings

One and one-half cups sifted flour; 1/2 teaspoonful salt; 3 level teaspoonfuls K C Baking Powder to the quart; 1/2 cup shortening; about 1/2 cup milk; apples.

Fill the cups of a buttered muffin pan with pared and sliced apples, sprinkle with salt and turn two or three tablespoonfuls of water into each cup. Sift together, three times, the flour, salt and baking powder; work in shortening and mix to a soft dough with the milk. Drop the dough from a spoon with the apples in the cup, giving it a smooth exterior. Let bake about twenty-five minutes. Invert the pan on a large serving-dish. Put a spoonful of hard sauce above the apple in each dumpling and finish with a grating of nutmeg.
