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FOUND DEAD ON BOX CAR

Ernest Wolff, a St. Louis waiter, found dead on box car at East Bernard.

Saturday evening the body of a man afterward identified as that of Ernest Wolff, was discovered by trainmen at East Bernard on top of a box car of train 243 going west on the Southern Pacific.

Wolff was about 40 or 45 years of age, and from papers found in his pockets, was a restaurant waiter, having worked in a number of restaurants in St. Louis.

His last trip was from St. Louis to San Antonio. That his death occurred from natural causes is conceded, but just how he happened to be on top of the car is a matter of conjecture. It is supposed that he climbed up to avoid a brakeman and the exertion brought on a heart attack.

In a note book in the dead man's pocket, was a postal card on which was written in ink: "Please write Mr. Otto Winters, 7051 Pine St., Sec. of the St. Louis Waiters Club, St. Louis, Mo., and send him my membership card in case I should die, also notify the following friends of mine: Mr. Henry Stoltze, 754 East 52nd St., Los Angeles, Cal.; Mrs. H. Steber, 4228 Beethoven Ave., St. Louis, Mo., also the Kellner Verein, 121, St. Louis, Mo." Among papers found in his pockets were two pawn tickets made in Houston, one on which he received \$1.10 for a suit of clothes, the other for which he received \$2.75 on a watch. Undertaker O. R. Davis brought the body here and prepared it for burial, the body being buried here on orders received by Mr. Davis after communicating with the St. Louis address given on the card.

Two Thrown Out, One Hurt at Bay City

Bay City, Tex., Aug. 28.—Coming from Wadsworth this morning in an automobile, John Guynn and Louis Gueno, two rice buyers, had a very narrow escape from serious injury. They were going at a good clip when a bad place in the road was struck, which resulted in the car turning turtle.

Mr. Guynn was caught under the car, but kept presence of mind well enough to cut the engine and get out.

Gueno was thrown from the car and sustained a dislocated shoulder. He was brought to the city, given medical attention and is now resting as well as possible.
