DR. F. O. NORRIS PASSES TO THE GREAT BEYOND

The Summons Came Sunday Morning at Seven O'clock and Eagle Lake Mourns the Loss of One of its Dearest Beloved.

Dr. Frank O. Norris, after suffering the many deaths that pass through the portals of this earthly body, gave up the struggle Sunday morning and the soul wended its flight onward unto that land from whose bourne no traveler ever returns. Though expectant, yet the citizenship of Eagle Lake was nevertheless shocked, and grieved beyond expression to learn of the death of so great and good a man as Dr. Norris. Known to every child, his name was in every household and the lesson from his character inevitable.

The condition of Dr. Norris' health became such last November that he decided to consult eminent physicians in New York, and made a trip there where he spent several months and returned home supposedly much improved, and in fact seemed to think he was cured; later, however, he was compelled to make another trip to the same physicians, and from that time on his condition grew worse. After several more months hope began to fade in to a dim impossibility, and other relatives were summoned to join Mrs. Norris, who had remained with the doctor at his bed side through the long illness. It was then decided best to return home with him, and though he made the trip, and felt even better than was anticipated, he gradually grew weaker and weaker, until the small threads upon which life's balance swings were broken, allowing the life and its earthly abiding place to separate forever, and it was thus the soul ascended by flights to the undiscovered land of God.

Dr. Frank O. Norris was born on the 11th day of November, 1850, in Fulton, Dallas county, Alabama. Dr. Norris was educated in Wilcox county, Alabama, and when quite young, at about the age of eighteen years, he began the study of medicine, attending lectures in Mobile, Ala., and graduating in 1876 from the Medical University of Alabama. The doctor was but eleven years of age at the breaking out of the civil war, and his youth is all that kept him out of the conflict, however, he had four brothers who fought on the Confederate side. Dr. Norris came to Colorado county in '75, then an undergraduate. He practiced medicine one year at Alleyton, then returned to Alabama and completed his medical course the following year. After graduating he returned to Eagle Lake, and at once seemed to win the confidence of the citizens, and entered upon a practice that constantly grew ever afterward. Dr. Norris often served the city in the capacity of alderman and school trustee, and had been requested time and again to become mayor, but being a man not seeking for office, always declined. Dr. Norris was a worthy member of the Baptist church, a

turned over to the Masons who conducted the services at the grave, using the Masonic form. The following friends of the deceased acted as pall bearers: Messrs. W. S. Strickland, H. McRee, Seymour Wagner, A. M. Waugh, H. Nussbaum and P. T. Gordon.

Dr. Norris has been a member of the local order of Masons for many years, and had received the highest honors the lodge could confer, being that of Past Master. The HEADLIGHT extends its sincere sympathy to the bereaved widow and the numerous relatives, and can only say let us look to the resurrection morning, when we shall all meet again never to part or have sorrowing hearts any more.

A FRIEND'S TRIBUTE.

Life is but a span—sooner or later each and every one of us must obey the inevitable law of nature requiring of us that we exchange this mortality for a spiritual life in a sphere of immortality. It admonishes us that it is necessary to prepare for the final summons. One recent experience more urgently impresses upon us the fact that delay is dangerous. The Grim Reaper has, with his ever ready blade, severed the tie which bound together the soul and body of one of our most prominent citizens, and wafted the spirit to a realm of unutterable bliss; it has blotted out the physical life of a man—the idol of his relatives and the impress of his life upon the hearts of his friends and the community. An intimate acquaintance with Dr. F. O. Norris, the subject of this sketch, of some thirty or forty years, enables me to testify most favorably as to his character and disposition. As a physician, friend and companion he

always exhibited those noble traits which stamped him as one of nature's noblemen. Ever ready to extend the hand of friendship to those with whom he came in contact, his position as a physician enabled him to more thoroughly observe conditions which required his attention, his hand and heart being always devoted to giving such relief as his sympathetic disposition suggested. A long and painful illness which he bore with Christianlike patience and fortitude brought out more vividly his noble traits. As the idol of his relatives his death leaves a vacancy which cannot be filled and the legacy of a pure christian life left to the community cannot fail to leave its impress. We tender our heartfelt sympathy to his sorrowing wife, to his relatives and to the citizens of this place express the hope that the great spirit which embodied charity toward all and malice toward none will endear his memory to his friends and acquaintances until time shall be no more. We drop a tear upon his grave assured that his spirit released from its earthly casket has found rest in realms above.—B.

A TERRIFIC WIND STORM

Heavy Wind and Rain Hit the City Sunday Evening—No Serious Damage.

A terrific wind and rain storm struck the city Sunday afternoon, and the damage was not serious. The wind looked as though it would do considerable damage. The most serious damage that resulted, however, was the breaking of a large plate glass window in the store of the Frank Stephens Co. The glass had previously been broken near the bottom and when the heavy wind hit it was unable to stand the strain, breaking into thousands of pieces. The derrick over the well at the Eagle Lake Water & Light Company's plant was also blown over, and a cross tie that was on the top of it was sent crashing through the roof of the engine room. Mr. Howard Strahan, while driving Mr. R. S. Simmons' car in the north part of the city received quite a scare. He was driving down town and when near the residence of Mr. Griffin, lightning struck in the road only a short distance away from the machine, stopping the motor of his car instantly and giving him considerable of a shock. The roofs of several small outbuildings were blown off and we are told that the rice in the fields to the east of the city was blown down considerably. The wind also did considerable damage to the canvas roof of the Dixie Theatre, badly tearing it.
