Horse Up a Tree.

Visitors to Perry Bar were
much surprised yesterday morn-
ing to see a horse up among the
branches of a tree. The animal
had gotten in its uncomfortable
position by falling ten feet from
a bank that overtopped the tree.
The tree probably saved the
horse's life.

Blocks and fall were fastened
to a tree stump on top of the hill
and leather belts were wrapped
about the horse. When the work
of hitching the belts was com-
pleted it was found that the ani-
mal could not be rescued until
several of the limbs of the tree
were cut off. This took consid-
erable time, during which the
horse rested and watched the
work of the score or more of men
who were trying to release him.
With the removal of the last limb
the horse was slowly drawn to
the top of the bank from which
he had fallen. A close examina-
tion revealed that outside of a few
scratches he was unhurt.—Balti-

Paint and Not

Paint was never before so high
as last year and this, about \$2.25

Texas Laws Affecting Women

It surely is time the laws of
Texas with regard to the rights
of married women were changed.
Many instances of their injustice
have come under our observation
lately. Women who are happily
married, whose husbands love
and cherish them give very little
thought to laws. But unfortun-
ately there are women who are
married to worthless men; self,
unscrupulous or dissipated, who
gratify their own appetites re-
gardless of the needs of wives
and children.

We know a woman, married to
a brilliant, but dissipated and un-
principled man. She sewed to
provide for her children. Re-
ceiving from a relative a small
legacy, she deposited the money
in a local bank, to be used in an
emergency. A few weeks later,
needing a new machine, she went
to the bank to draw out money
to pay for it; when to her dismay,
she found her husband had drawn
it all out and spent it on himself.

A husband can take any piece
of property which his wife has
worked and paid for and sell it,
and she can not prevent his doing
so. He can collect and spend her
earnings, even though she be not
living with him.

In fact, the only real good law
in Texas to protect married wo-
men with which we are familiar,
is the homestead law.

On the whole we think women
in Texas are as well treated as
anywhere else but it is not be-
cause the law protects their in-
terests. There are women who
need this protection—many of
them—and the laws of the state
should give it to them. Not only
for their own sakes, but for the
sake of the children dependent
upon them as well. No laws can
be more important than those
affecting the home. For from
these homes come the state's
greatest asset, her future citi-
zens.—Gonzales Inquirer.
