COUNTY IS DIVERSIFYING

Colorado County at Dallas Fair With a Lavish Display.

The Dallas News says: Colorado county is on hand as usual with a lavish display of Colorado county resources. This county is three counties removed from the Gulf of Mexico, but finds it to its advantage to make a showing at the great State Fair.

M. C. Yates is in charge of the exhibit and yesterday morning was busy putting the finishing touches to the display.

There is a crying demand in Eagle Lake for rent houses. Hardly a week passes but what some stranger calls at this office to ask if our paper is carrying any house for rent. Advertisements. Mr. T. L. Loughbridge, secretary of the business league, tells us that he has inquiries for rent houses on an average of one a day. There is not a vacant house for rent in the town, and Mr. Loughbridge says if there were to be erected twenty-five rent houses he is reasonably sure that he could rent every one of them by the middle of next month. If Eagle Lake had more rent houses there would be more families living in Eagle Lake, and what would this mean to our city? It means that every additional family living here adds just that much to every line of business in the town. Something should be done along this line, for we need more rent houses here. One solution to supply the growing demand for houses would be the organization of a company, composed of local capital for the purpose of building rent houses. If this can not be done, then out side capital should learn of the proposition. There is not a doubt but that it would prove a big paying proposition, for Eagle Lake is a growing town. There has been a scarcity of rent houses here for ten years, and the demand grows stronger every day.

A display of seven different grades of manufactured sugar is among the interesting features of the exhibit, as are also rows of preserved figs and other canned fruits and vegetables. Not the least among the evidences given of the diversified resources of the county are bottles of wine manufactured in Colorado county from Colorado county grapes. One vineyard of thirty-six acres is said to have returned to its owner the sum of \$6,000 from wine sales this season.

Some long staple cotton, a product of Colorado county, is attracting attention. A bale of this cotton sold at New Orleans for 28 cents per pound. Long staple cotton, supposed by some to find existence in Red River county alone, in so far as the State of Texas is concerned, was tried in Colorado county this year and found to be a perfect success, and it is expected that it will be more extensively grown next season.

Most excellent samples of corn broom corn, sugar cane and other staples, as well as a great variety of fruits and vegetables, add largely to the value of the display. This booth is attracting much attention and those in charge are receiving many inquiries relative to land values and opportunities for investment.
