Make Educational Provision

No people can go up the scale of civilization beyond their mental development and capacity to think and act, and with our system of government to maintain, with ever-growing demands upon the people at large, the duty of the state to educate the masses is clear, and the call to do so is imperative, for an ignorant citizen can never be a forceful quantity in shaping and maintaining public policies. The education of the boys and girls of today means the development of the men and women of tomorrow to deal intelligently with the civic questions in which will be involved the structure and strength of governmental life. Universities, colleges and well appointed district schools must be amply maintained to the end and our legislators must be wide-awake to this fact in order to provide liberal and adequate appropriations for the establishment and maintenance of state institutions of learning.

In the days of the pioneer the struggle was most largely physical, and the development of the hardy scouts of civilization was imperative, along the line of physical daring and endurance, but the demand now is not for leaders like Daniel Boone and his hardy companions, but it is for men of developed mind to dare to enter and conquer the unexplored forests of thought, in order that a more forceful citizenry may appreciate and battle with the problems of government.

The time has passed, never to return, when the prelatial edict will settle the minds and course of men, unless it is backed by reason, and what men term reason uncontrolled is dangerous to every interest of the race, and every church must give a reason for its claim, in order to win and hold men, and its ministry and laity must be abreast with the intellectual critics, who unopposed will determine the trend of thought and the course of human action. I am strictly a Protestant, and yet I am not blind to or allow prejudice to prevent me from seeing and commending the wisdom displayed by the Roman Catholic Church in the ample provision she makes for the education of her people, and if some Protestants would quit grumbling at Rome and make enlarged provision for the education of their young people, they would be both wiser and more effective along their own lines of ecclesiastical work. For one, while dissenting from her teaching, I admire the wisdom displayed by

Roman Catholics in their broad and ample educational provision, for caring for and developing the youth of our country, not simply through organization, but through intelligent organization, for the character of any government, based upon the will of the people, must depend upon the men and women making up its citizenry.

The many political, social and religious isms now contending for recognition are calculated to mystify and mislead people who are ignorant or even but practically educated, so that they are not able to analyze propositions and detect error. The growth of the masses in intelligence, in ratio to our public education, accounts for the increased independence of the actual and progressive voters, and party control is not so complete as it used to be, when the masses had but little opportunity to acquire an education. The public press

with broader view and higher ideals, is far more forceful and independent than it used to be, and its tremendous influence is being felt by the people at large, and felt to betterment, along lines political and social, and there is no greater agency outside of our schools for educating the masses than the clean and ably conducted newspaper, and in

spite of yellow journalism the majority of our metropolitan newspapers are doing a great educational work.

We need a great revival in educational work both in the state and the churches, the large investment in money to build and maintain amply for the education of young men and women, and the state or church which ignores this necessity must be content to lag behind and find our youth seeking an education elsewhere to become forceful quantities in other sections and other religious bodies.

Let the state establish and maintain schools of high grade, and the church provide strong and amply endowed schools of high grade for the full furnishing of her young men and women and no greater heritage can be left the coming generations, an heritage for above mere money. Let our children have full education, and you give them the best means to work out highest ends in all the walks of life.—Rev. W. T. Bolling.
