Mr. O. G. Kolberg, special farm demonstration agent for Colorado county, was in Hallettsville Monday attending the corn show of the Lavaca County Boys' Corn Club. The event was in charge of the Hallettsville Commercial club, and the occasion was made a semi-holiday with band concerts on the streets in the morning, and in the opera house during the afternoon, where addresses were made by E. Gentry, field agent for Texas and Oklahoma, and by J. L. Quicksall, state agent for farm demonstration work, and other speakers. Handsome prizes were awarded to the boys whose corn exhibits scored highest points. The winner of first honors is a lad of about 14 years whose demonstration acre yielded a few pounds less than 75 bushels. Many a farmer in this section would have been proud to have made a crop like that on his farm in a year.

The farmers of Lavaca county showed great interest in the work, and filled the hall to overflowing. After the exercises at the opera house a ball game was played between Hallettsville and Shiner high schools in which the former came off victorious to the score of 7 to 6. Mr. Kolberg's mission to Hallettsville was made with a view to getting pointers for similar work in this county.
