The Southern Pacific will put on another day passenger train between Houston and San Antonio, beginning next Sunday, November 10th, at which time numbers 7 and 8 will also change schedule. The new trains will be known as numbers 1 and 2. No. 1, west bound will reach Eagle Lake about 10 o'clock in the morning, going west. No. 7, west bound, now arriving here at 1:17 p. m., will reach here about 2:40 p. m. No. 2, the new train going east will arrive here about 1:30 p. m. No. 8, east bound, now arriving here at 8:45 p. m., will arrive about 5:00 p. m.

Capt. K. F. Cunningham, was up from the Bonus camp Wednesday to receive twenty-one convicts sent here from Sugarland, and he received twenty-five more at noon today. These men will be used in taking off the sugar cane crop at the Bonus plantation. Captain Cunningham, in conversation with The Headlight man, stated that while the cane crop generally speaking is of course short owing to the severe drouth, he has some cane, that will make twenty-five tons to the acre, and this too with no rain on it since the third of June. "I've got some of the finest cane in Texas," said Captain Cunningham, "and it would be a big advertisement for this wonderful country for people who are interested in this section to take a look at it." Captain Cunningham is one of the most successful men in Texas in the handling of convict labor. He does not tolerate it by no one under his management, and yet he gets better and more efficient work out of convicts than any man in the state. He has that way of knowing how. He never speaks harshly and roughly to convicts just because they are convicts, but he impresses firmly upon them what they are expected to do, and they do it, and when he has occasion to correct them he does it in a firm manner. The Captain is a splendid judge of human nature. He studies the dispositions of the men under his care and he understands the nature of every one of them. All the convicts respect and like Captain Cunningham, and on several occasions we have noticed convicts who have served their time, how they told him goodbye, thanking him for his kindness to them while they were under his charge. "Goodbye, Captain," said one here on the streets only a few weeks ago, "you've been good to me and I'll never forget it; God bless you, for there are not many like you." Captain Cunningham has less trouble with his men and gets more good work out of them than probably any man handling convicts in the state. It's because he uses kindness in working them—even convicts appreciate kindness.
