Breaking Up "Hardpan".

In transplanting trees where soil is underlaid with hardpan, or impervious clay, it pays well to break this bottom soil, for the more free room and loose earth given to the roots that better will the tree grow and thrive. One method that pays is to use dynamite on about 40 percent strength discharged at a depth of about three feet. In many places this method is cheaper than digging holes, especially for deep rooted trees. Try it and you will not have to repent your shade trees. The improved varieties of pecans also respond in vigorous growth and early bearing when soil is so prepared.
