At the last meeting of the city council the newly elected aldermen and city attorney were sworn in upon their official duties. Mr. W. E. Lenhart was appointed mayor pro tem, to act in the capacity of mayor during the absence of Mayor Putney.

The Mayor appointed the following committees: Street committee, Wirtz and Brosig; water and light committee, Carey and Chester; finance committee, Lenhart and Chester; ordinance committee, Wirtz and Brosig. The election of a city secretary to succeed O. R. Davis was deferred until the next meeting. There are three applicants for the office, Messrs. R. E. Walker, W. E. McRree and E. A. Toliver.

The mayor appointed a committee to get up costs and estimates to erect a city hall and improve the grounds.

Mr. W. P. Gearold, father of Alderman Gearold, who died in Houston two weeks ago, leaves an estate valued at between \$75,000 and \$100,000. In his will he leaves to his daughter, Alice Teasdale, the sum of \$3,000; to Mr. Gearold of this city, \$4,000 to his wife \$500; to Willie P. Bammel, a friend, \$5,000; to J. H. Gorman, a friend, \$40,000. Owing to the peculiarity of the will, Mr. Gearold was a visitor to Houston this week to have the same investigated. He has employed attorneys to look into the same.
