

MRS. GUSSIE STAFFORD DIED SUDDENLY THIS MORNING.

Relatives Left on First Train For San Antonio After Receiving Meager News of Mrs. Stafford's Sudden Death in That City This Morning.

Mrs. Gussie Stafford, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Alex Callison of this city, died suddenly in San Antonio this (Friday) morning between five and six o'clock. At the hour of going to press the relatives had received but little information of her death. Mrs. Stafford was in the best of health and her death is thought to have been due to heart failure or something of that nature. She was in Eagle Lake only a couple of weeks ago visiting her relatives here. She leaves a husband and four children. Lyle Stafford of Eagle Lake, James and Gus and Ethel Stafford of San Antonio. Mr. Stafford was away from home at the time of her death, being in Carizzo Springs, their former home, on a business visit. Mr. Stafford and family moved to San Antonio only a few weeks ago from Carizzo Springs, and the family is yet but slightly

known to the people of the community of San Antonio in which they are now living. For this reason, and thinking possible the children were alone, Mr. Stafford being away from San Antonio, Mr. Lyle Stafford immediately telephoned Mrs. Ed. Rand of San Antonio after learning of his mother's death this morning, asking her to go to their home at once. Mr. and Mrs. Alex Callison, the mother and father, Mr. N. W. Callison, brother and Mr. Lyle Stafford, son, left on the ten o'clock train this morning for San Antonio. They were joined in Columbus by Mrs. Chas. Kuntze, a sister, and Miss Glenn Harbert, a niece. Mr. W. F. B. Wicker, a half brother of Mrs. Stafford left on the afternoon train for San Antonio. At the time the relatives left this morning, no funeral arrangements had been made.

Spirit answers to spirit and the poor are chilled and starved by the selfish spirit in which we give them food and shelter.

If we sent our love with our dollars to the poorhouse, it would be quite a different place. Charity with love enables and uplifts the giver and the receiver feels no reproach in accepting it.—Fort Worth Record.
