Colquitt Orders Works of Restor-
ing Alamo to Begin at Once.

Austin, Texas, May 13.—The
governor, through Dr. A. B. Con-
ley, superintendent of public
buildings and grounds, has just
given instructions to J. B.
Nitschke, state buildings inspec-
tor, to resume the work of re-
suming work of repairing and re-
restoring the Alamo property
immediately after the supreme
court has acted on the motion for
a rehearing in the Alamo case.
The motion for a rehearing by

the Daughters of the Republic
has not as yet been filed in the
supreme court, and the time for
the taking of such action will ex-
pire on Thursday. In the event
the motion is not filed by that
time, then the state will be ready
to take up the work at San Anto-
nio on the mission property,
within a few days thereafter. If
the motion is filed, the supreme
court will more than likely act at
an early date thereon so as to
dispose of the question.

Inspector Nitschke, who left
last night for College Station to
superintend the construction of the
new buildings there, said before
leaving that he has his force of
men ready to resume the work
at San Antonio. The state has
about \$4000 with which to carry
on the work, and the governor
will ask the legislature at the
coming special session to make
an additional appropriation of
\$5000 for use in completing the

work in all \$10,000.
