BANKS ARE WARNED TO BEWARE CHECK RAISER

Operator for Bankers' Insurance Company in Houston on Trail of Clever Swindler.

The Texas Bankers' Association's detective office has furnished the Headlight with the following article for publication: Bankers in Houston are being warned by a special representative of a bankers' insurance company to be on the alert for an unusually clever check raiser who is operating successfully throughout the State. The operator spent Thursday calling on the local bankers and showing them samples of the check raiser's work.

Checks have been raised at Humble, Alief and Richmond. At Alief a check was raised from

Hood & McLendon. The firm then turned it over to its bankers, and the check passed through the hands of two banks and was returned to the writer before the fact that it was raised was discovered.

The operator carried with him a check raised from \$2.10 to \$50.10 on what is known as "safety paper," and which is supposed to be proof against the tricks of check raiser. The check passed through a Wichita Falls bank and a Fort Worth bank.
