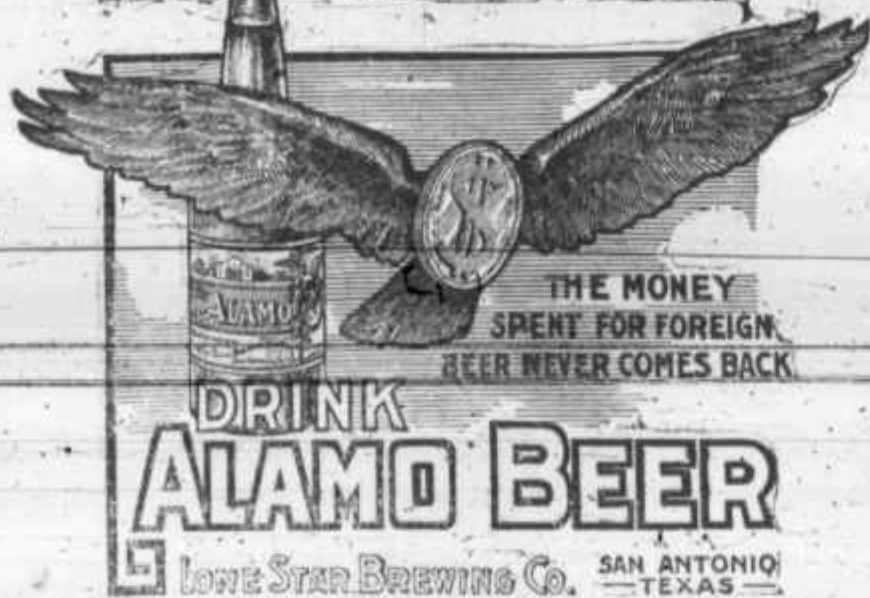

Champion Snake Story

The molly cotton tail has always been considered the most meek and non-combative animal in existence, but Noah Nance furnished The News with an item yesterday which disproves that idea, showing that the mother instinct makes the animal as pugnacious on occasion as other animals. At the same time the incident which proves its pugnacity furnishes us the champion snake story, not only of the season, but of all the snake stories that the editor has ever heard. Mr. Nance says that if anybody had told him about it, he wouldn't have believed it, and that he wouldn't expect the reporter to believe it unless he was prepared to make affidavit that he had seen it with his own eyes.

He said that on Wednesday morning about 11 o'clock while he was out in the brush and pasture three miles west of town, he heard a young rabbit squealing in a patch of weeds near a thicket. He knew from the sounds of distress that something had hold of it and he decided to investigate. Dismounting and hitching his horse he started toward the weeds when he saw an old mother rabbit come tearing from the thicket toward the patch of weeds, and about the same time he discovered a black coachwhip snake with the young rabbit in its coil. The snake didn't see him and he stood and watched developments.

When the old rabbit reached the snake she pounced on it. The snake bent a hasty retreat, tearing out to a haw bush about thirty feet away with the young rabbit in its mouth. When it got to the bush it climbed it and crawled as far out on the topmost limb as it could reach, still holding on to its prey. Mr. Nance says that after it got in the bush the mother rabbit ran around the trunk of it like a fice when it has a squirrel treed. The young rabbit never let up squealing and the mother seemed to be distracted. She reared up on her hind legs and planted her fore legs against the bush and her eyes bulged almost out of their sockets. When Mr. Nance

came up the snake poked its head out and looked at him, but still held to the prey.
