VASELINE A CURE FOR DEADLY CONSUMPTION

San Angelo Physician Says Use
Vaseline for the Great White
Plague.

Dr. Stanley Sevier Warren, the
San Angelo physician who main-
tains that phenol-petrolatum or
common commercial carbollated
vaseline is a powerful therapeutic
agent in the treatment of pulmo-
nary tuberculosis, issued the fol-
lowing statement to the pub-
lic:

"In view of the numerous in-
quiries I am receiving from the
general public and the medical
profession I desire to say the fol-
lowing:
"First, it is not necessary to
come here for treatment. Any
competent physician can admin-
ister the treatment and the pa-
tients should place themselves
under the family physician's care.
"Second, there is no danger in
using it, and it requires several
months to get an arrestation of
the disease so that nature can re-
store tissues and physiological
functions to their normal condi-
tions. The disease known as
phthisis is a chronic one and is
the result of months and, in many
instances, years, of a wasting
disease process. A remedy can
check this condition, but nature
alone can reproduce a healthy
structure.

"I desire especially to caution
patients not to attempt to use the
treatment hypodermatically, but
I do suggest and advise them to
begin the inunctions immedi-
ately because while this is a slow
mode of treatment yet it is of
great benefit, and the manner in
which I have for some time treat-
ed my patients, and even now I
use it a great deal in conjunction
with the hypodermic treatment.
This will be a great aid to the
physician who can begin the
treatment as soon as he can ob-
tain the solution for hypodermic
treatment.

"Anyone can procure for a
small sum at any pharmacy a vial
of rich yellow vaseline containing
from one and one-half to two per
cent of carbolic acid which is suf-
ficient for three or four treat-
ments. It should be gently rub-
bed over the front, back and
sides of the chest daily, at that
time of day when the tempera-
ture is highest.

"Let me caution tubercular
patients and indeed beg of them
not to relax from the sanitary
and hygienic precautions under
which they are living. This they
owe to themselves, their families
and the general public.
"Discontinue any nostrum or
patent medicine that one might
be taking. Do not be misled by
any quick advertisements—num-
bers of whom will soon come out
with the statement that they are
familiar with the statement or
perhaps that I have given them
especial instructions.

"Stick to honest, earnest, med-
ical men who are well known to
you and to the community. They
will give both you and me fair
treatment, and will not hesitate
to tell you within a reasonable
time whether they find it of any
value."

Jackass Statistics.

In the spring of 1910 the
enumerators of the Federal Cen-
sus Department visited every
farm house in Colorado County
and made inquiries pertaining to
the various phases of our agricul-
ture. The result of the canvass-
es have just been published and
reveal some unique, as interest-
ing, information. According to
the reports there are 70 jackasses
on the farms and ranges of this
county and their total valuation
is given at \$5,982.

The jackass population of Tex-
as is 20,408 which have a total
value of \$720,074. Only two
farms out of one hundred re-
ported jackasses at the last cen-
sus and the total number of Tex-
as farms reporting was 8,151.
The average value per head is
\$34.28 or \$12.47 more than that
of the Texas horse.—Commercial
Secretaries.
