Mother of Mrs. S. O. McCarty Died in San Antonio Tuesday.

San Antonio, Texas, June 11—Mrs. Volney Ellis, aged 75 years, died at her home, 115 West Agave, Tuesday. She was one of the first graduates of Smith's College for Young Ladies at Austin. She lived for a number of years at Hallettsville, where her husband practiced law for forty years, and from there moved to Lockhart and came to San Antonio five years ago to reside.

She is survived by her husband, Volney Ellis, a retired lawyer of this city, who is prominently known all over the state; also six daughters, Misses Anna and Norma Ellis, Mrs. Anthony Dibrel, Mrs. F. L. Hillyer of San Antonio, Mrs. Percy Paisson of Uvalde, Mrs. S. O. McCarty of Eagle Lake, two sons, Olinthus Ellis of Lockhart, and R. B. Ellis of Center Point; a brother, John Buchanan, county clerk of Lavaca county, and a sister, Mrs. Robert Brown of Campbellton.

Her father, John Buchanan, was Spanish translator for the land office in the days when Texas was a republic and was afterwards a trusted secretary for General Sam Houston.

A Potato Association is Needed
The potato market has "busted" to a frazzle, potatoes selling here this week at 40c per bushel and no demand for them at that price. We need an association of the potato growers of this section and we need it badly. The only salvation for the potato industry is through an association. A competent man must be in charge of this association. When we say a competent man, we mean a man who thoroughly understands the potato business. This man, acting for the association, to impartially and without favor, grade every car of potatoes that is shipped out by a member of the association. This is something that has been sorely needed this season. The potato market should not be governed by a car of "ratty" looking potatoes, as it has been done this year. For instance, if potatoes are self-

selected, the market gets out a carload of very poor potatoes and has to sell them for say 75c per bushel. If the potato grower handled through an association, then the price of choice potatoes would remain at \$1.00, and the carload sold at 75c would be classed as second or third grade.

But, as things are at present, if a grower gets out a car of potatoes he knows the stock is poor and has to sell them under market price, then the market is governed by that price. For instance, if some planter sells a car of sorry potatoes for 75 cents, as stated above, when the market price is \$1.00, the next buyer is going to offer only 75 cents also. Simply because the stock of potatoes is not graded, and the better class of spuds should naturally bring a better price on the market than poor ones. There never was so much need of a potato growers' association than now, and unless the business is gotten under the management and direction of an association before another season, the potato acreage of this section is going to be greatly decreased.
