

Potatoes Sell Cheap in Chicago

Chicago, June 10.—The high cost of living received a jolt yesterday when old white Burbank potatoes were offered in Chicago at 40 cents a bushel, the lowest price in the history of local dealers. A year ago these potatoes were selling at \$1 and \$1.15 a bushel. The potatoes offered yesterday were shipped from Minnesota at a time when the market price was between 80 and 90 cents. The consignees put the prices down to 40, 80, 20 and finally to 10 cents, which barely paid the freight charges, but still there were no takers. Consumers are paying 18 to 20 cents a peck to retailers for old potatoes, and sales to the public by shippers in the railroad yards were planned today.
