Brosig. 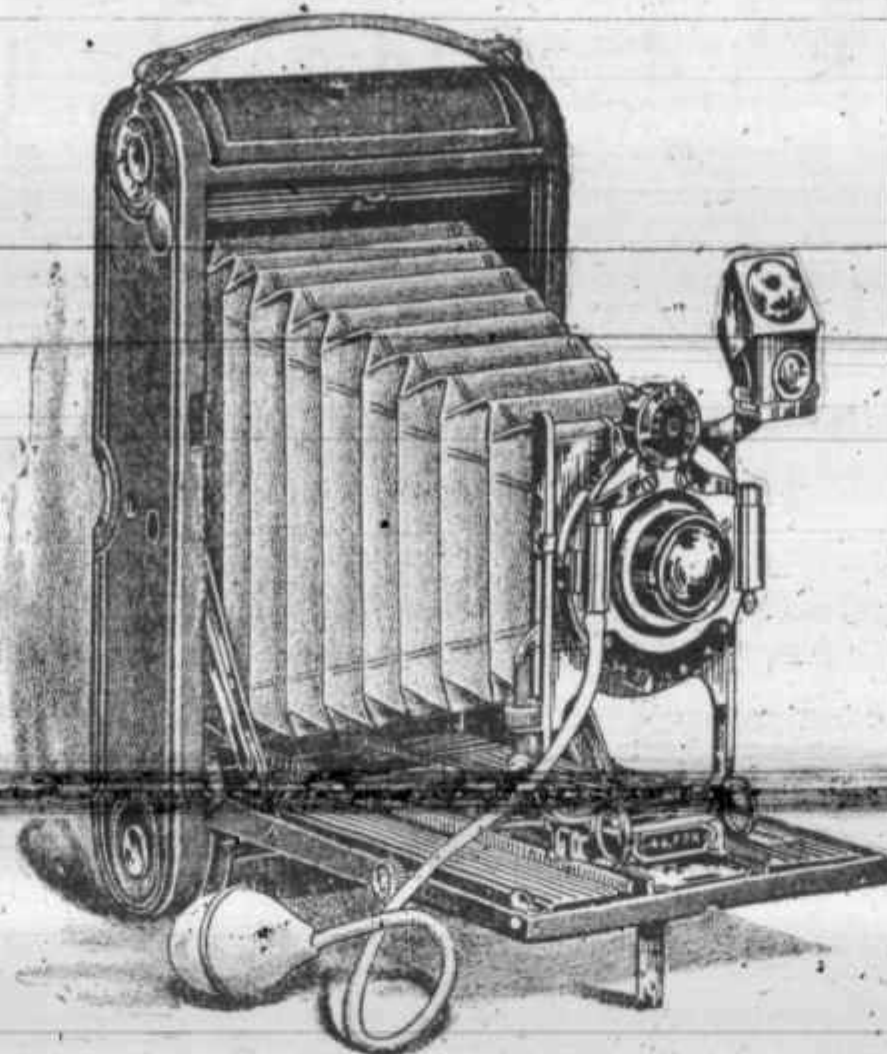
