The rice planters of the Eagle Lake district held a meeting at Frazer's opera house yesterday afternoon. The meeting was well attended by the rice planters and many business men of the city were present. Mr. E. A. Egnus, who is a member of the board of trustees of the Southern Rice Growers' Milling Association, addressed the meeting and explained the plans and purposes of the new organization and about fifty of the leading rice growers signed contracts covering the sale of their rice for a period of ten years. The new organization is meeting with favor in all parts of the rice belt and is destined to become the controlling factor in the milling and distribution of clean rice. Judging from the expression of opinions heard on the street here yesterday it is likely that over ninety-five per cent of the planters in the Eagle Lake district will rally to the support of the rice growers' milling association.

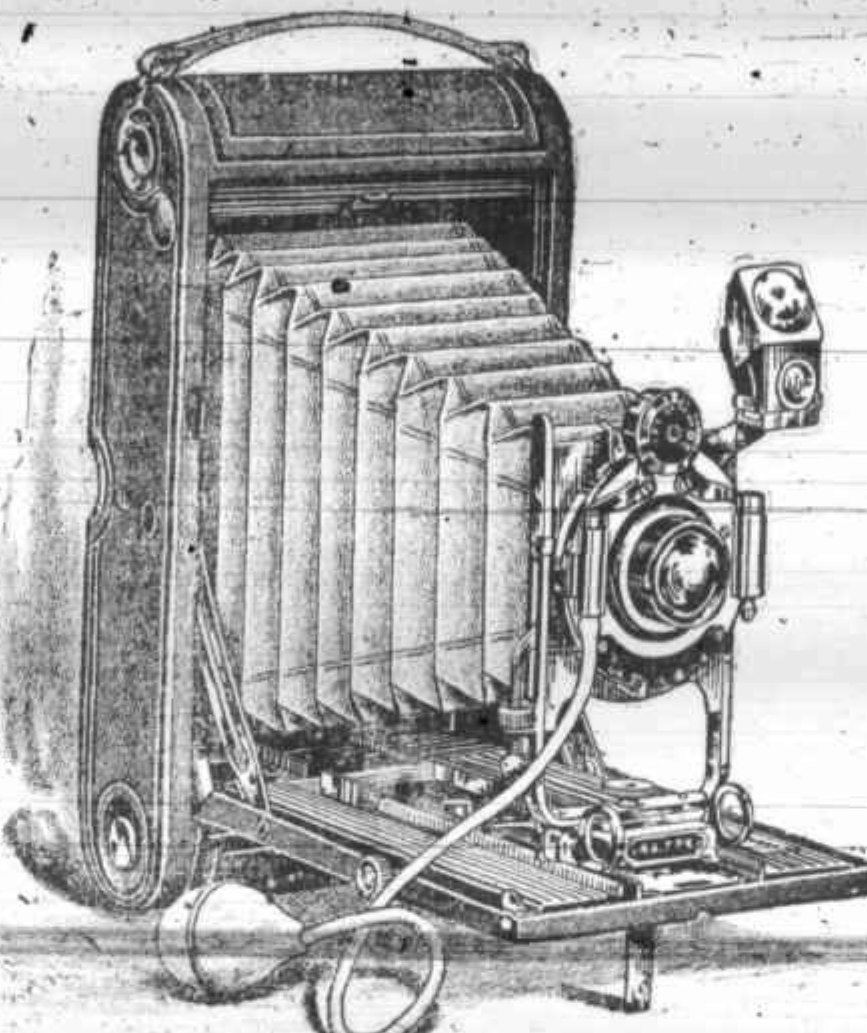

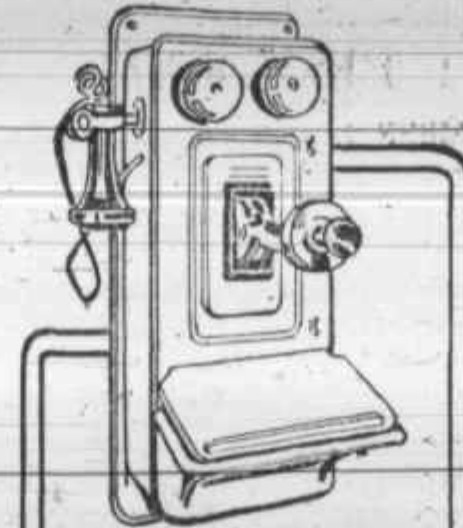

ELECTION ORDER

Be it ordered by the board of trustees of the Eagle Lake Independent School District that an election be held at the Band Stand in the Public Park in the town of Eagle Lake in the said Eagle Lake Independent School District on the 20th day of September, 1913, to determine whether the board of trustees of the said district shall have power to annually levy and collect a tax upon all taxable property in said district, for the support and maintenance of public schools in said Eagle Lake Independent School District, of and at the rate of not exceeding fifty cents on the One Hundred Dollars (\$100) valuation of taxable property in the district; such tax, if voted, to be levied and collected for the year 1913 and annually thereafter unless it be discontinued as provided by law.

G. E. Boothe is hereby appointed manager of said election, and he shall select two judges and two clerks to assist him in holding same.

None but property tax payers who are qualified voters in said Eagle Lake Independent School District, shall vote at said election.

A copy of this order signed by the president and attested by the secretary of this board shall serve as proper notice of said election, and the president shall cause notice of said election to be given in accordance with law.

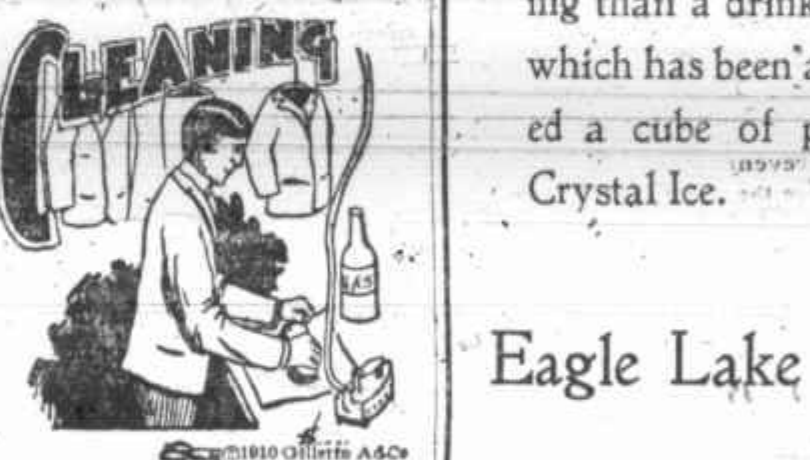
