CAREY SHAW VICTIM OF SWINDLERS.

Three men are said to be under arrest in Terre Haute, Ind., charged with swindling Carey Shaw and Ray Cunningham out of \$12,000. No details were contained in the message, but it is stated that Messrs. Shaw and Cunningham are in Terre Haute for the purpose of identifying the men in custody.

An attempt was made to secure details of the charge at Mr. Shaw's home. Mrs. Shaw said her husband had been out of the city about three days, but she could not discuss the charge or tell what circumstances led to it. —Houston Chronicle.

Terre Haute, Ind., Sept. 2.—With the arrest here today of George Reed, John Collins and Hugh McInnis of Indianapolis on complaint of Carey Shaw of Houston, Texas, the police declare they have ended the operation of the Maybray swindle syndicate and included "fake" prize fights.

Mr. Shaw lost \$7,500, according to the police, which he was induced to place in a safety deposit box here. He had brought the money from Houston to invest in a deal for 20,000 acres of Missouri land. Upon his arrival he was shown a large amount of money by the alleged confidence men and asked to place his money with theirs and put it in the box while he and two of the men went to inspect the land. The authorities say that en route St. Louis, Shaw was induced to give up the key to the box containing the money and his companions disappeared.

Another Texas banker said to have been swindled by the gang is Ray Cunningham of Franklin, Texas, who is on his way here to aid in the prosecution of the men. Both Cunningham and Shaw met the "scout" for the alleged gang in their home towns. The operations of the gang, the authorities assert, were carried on in Kansas as well as in Indiana and many victims from both states are said to have filed complaints of swindles. The police expect other arrests to be made in several cities soon, they say.
