Cotton Should Not Be Mixed.

"A chain is no stronger than its weakest link." A bale of cotton is not much better than the poorest cotton in it. Government experimenters have reached this conclusion in regard to cotton.

Already it has been found that when one part of a poor grade of cotton is mixed with nine parts of a higher grade, the poor cotton shows in the finished manufactured product.

To make the matter very clear, if a farmer has 450 pounds of a good grade of cotton and fifty

pounds of a lower grade, not one pound of the lower grade should be allowed to go into the bale. The 450 pounds of good unmixed cotton is worth more than a 500 pound bale with a streak of lean and a streak of fat. Atlanta Constitution.

Welcome the Stranger.

The superintendent of a local Sunday School told his school last Sunday of his experience in another town on a recent Sabbath

morning. He went to Sunday School early but not a soul welcomed him, no one shook hands with him, and no one invited him to take a seat in a class. From his experience he drew a lesson for his own school, and cautioned against falling into the same error of indifference to and neglect of strangers. The superintendent said he expected to visit the town again in which he had the experience related, but he also said that he did not expect to again visit that same Sunday School. While listening to the Sunday School leader the Bulletin editor wondered if Brownwood people were not sometimes inclined to treat strangers, visitors to our town, new comers, here with similar coldness and indifference. It is mighty easy to look after one's own affairs and let the stranger take care of himself, mighty easy to say that it is none of your affair whether he finds the right church, the right associates or the right friends. We are too apt to let the dollar for which so many of us seem to be working to the exclusion of everything else, obstruct our vision of the stranger, and sometimes the result is that he gets a distaste for our town, he thinks that we are too cold, too much centered on commercial affairs, and when he does he passes us up for some other town. We ought to greet the stranger within our gates with a smile and a hearty handshake, a word of welcome that has a ring of sincerity about it. We ought to tell him that we are glad he has cast his lot with us, or that we are pleased that he has visited us--and the chances are good that if we do pursue that sort of policy he will be glad he came and he will want to stay. Report of Grand Jury.

To the Hon. M. Kennon, Judge of the 25th Judicial District of Texas:

We the Grand Jury, duly empanelled and sworn for the September term 1913, in and for Colorado County, Texas, at the conclusion of our labor, beg leave to submit the following report:

We have carefully and conscientiously investigated every criminal offense brought to our notice and as a result of our investigations we have found and returned into Court five bills of indictment for felonies and four bills of indictment for misdemeanors.

We have examined both the east and north bridges and so far as we are able to determine both are in fairly good condition, except the north bridge is badly in need of piling on north approach and same should be repaired as early as practicable.

We found the jail to be in as good sanitary condition as could be expected, while the prisoners are not exposed to some back leaks discovered in the jail, yet there are some, and we hereby recommend that the necessary repairing be done. The inmates say they are satisfied with manner in which they are treated and cared for in general.

We recommend that someone whose competency is unquestionable be employed to audit the book of the city treasurer of the city of Columbus prior to the time of the shortage for the reason that we have been unable to obtain sufficient evidence to positively fix the date of the reported shortage.

We have visited the County Farm and as to whether or not it should be maintained and is a paying proposition under its present management we are unable to tell.

We visited the Poor House and the paupers and lunatics and find that they are well cared for.

We desire to express our thanks to the District Attorneys for their assistance in our labor.
