When Ducks May Be Shot.

For some time past there has been a general impression, and the statement has been published in the press, that there was a Federal law which prevented the shooting of ducks and geese, the law being passed by a recent session of Congress. It now transpires that these fowls may be shot during a certain season, the object of the law being to protect the birds during their migratory flights from the north to the south and from the south to the north.

Sportsmen who delight in duck

shooting will be delighted to learn that they may yet shoot ducks for a couple of months during the winter.

Under the new law the country is divided into two zones, northern and southern, and in each zone there is an open season during which ducks and geese may be killed. In the northern zone the open season begins September 1st of each year and ends December 15th of each year. In the southern zone the season begins October 1st and closes January 15th.
