## THIS IS YOM KIPPUR DAY OF ATONEMENT.

All of the places of business of the Jewish merchants in Eagle Lake will close this afternoon at 6 o'clock and remain closed until 6 o'clock Saturday evening.

The day of Atonement, according to the Biblical tradition, is one in the cycle of holidays instituted by Moses, it occurs on the tenth day of the seventh month of the Jewish calendar called "Tishri," and is distinguished by abstaining thereon from food and by an elaborate ceremonial.

The Day of Atonement completes the penitential period of 10 days that begins with New Year holiday, the season of repentance and prayers. It absolves from sin against God, but not from sins against a fellow man unless the pardon of the offended person is secured. Hence the custom of terminating on the eve of the last day all feuds and disputes (Yomo Kippur).

Even the souls of the dead are included in the community of those pardoned on the Day of Atonement. It is customary for the children to have public mention made in the synagogue of their departed parents and to make charitable gifts on behalf of their souls.

But no amount of charity will avail the soul of the wicked man. The services in the synagogue opens in the evening with the "Kol Nidre." The devotions during the day are continuous from evening until evening.

The day is the keystone of the Postexilic Judaism. It has a double character; it is both a fast day and a festival day; it comprises the elements of the great fast day of the year, on which are prohibited all those things from which the people abstain on any other day, such as eating and drinking, bathing and anointing, the wearing of sandals or shoes in private places.

The reading from the law in the morning portion is followed by the reading from the prophet Isaiah (lvii, 15; lviii, 14) which has been significantly chosen to impress the people with the lesson that the external rite of fasting is valueless without the works of righteousness and beneficence.

The whole idea underlying atonement according to the Rabbinical view, is regeneration, restoration of the original state of man in his relation to God.

The means of atonement are repentance, reparation of wrong and prayers, fasting and charity. The pious Jew becomes forgetful of the flesh and its wants, and banishing hatred, ill feelings and all ignoble thoughts, seeks to be occupied exclusively with things spiritual. However rigorously the Rabbinical law may insist on the outward manifestations of contrition, the corrective is provided for in the lesson from the prophets (Isaiah lviii; Jonah), which teach that the true fast day in which God delights is a spirit of devotion, kindness and penitence.

The serious character impressed upon the day from the time of its institution has been preserved to the present day, no matter how much else has fallen into desuetude, so strong is its hold upon the Jewish conscience that no Jew, unless he has cut himself entirely loose from the synagogue, will fail to observe the Day of Atonement by resting from his daily pursuits and attending services in the synagogue.

Now give the sayings of Solomon a run, read his sayings, digest them thoroughly and profit thereby.

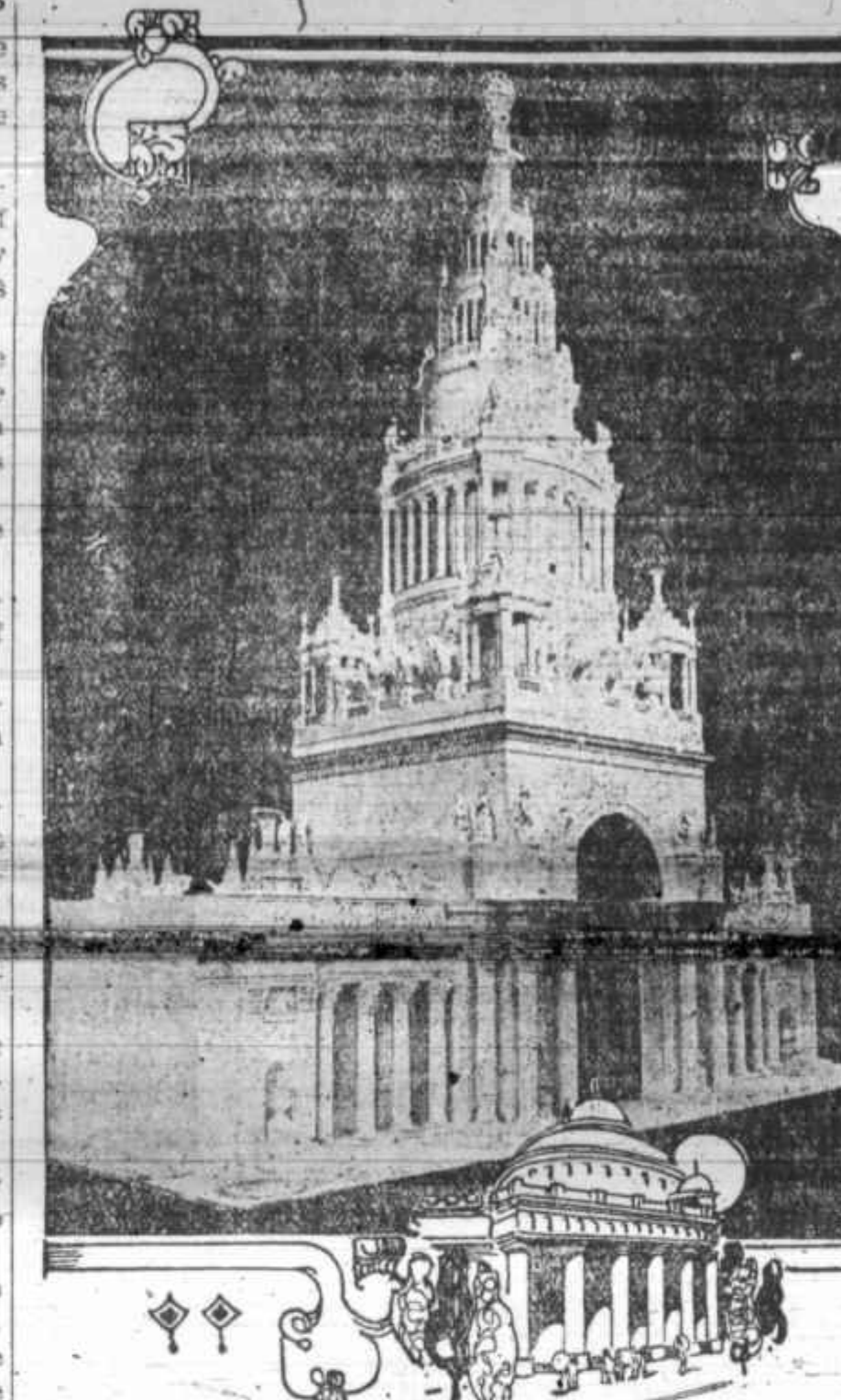
