Election Order.

Be it ordered by the board of
trustees of the Eagle Lake Inde-
pendent School District that an
election be held at the City Council
room in the town of Eagle
Lake in said Eagle Lake Inde-
pendent School District on the
25th day of November, 1913, to
determine whether the board of
trustees of said district shall
have power to annually levy and
collect a tax upon all taxable prop-
erty in said district, for the
support and maintenance of pub-
lic free schools in said Eagle
Lake Independent School Dis-
trict, of and at the rate of not to
exceed 50 cts on \$100.00 valuation
such tax, if voted, to be levied
and collected for the year 1913
and annually thereafter unless
it be discontinued as provided by
law.

J. E. Roberts is hereby ap-
pointed manager of said election,
and he shall select two judges
and two clerks to assist him in
holding the same.

None but property tax payers
who are qualified voters in said
Eagle Lake Independent School
District, shall vote at said elec-
tion.

A copy of this order signed by
the president and attested by the
secretary of this board shall
serve as proper notice of said
election, and the president shall
cause notice of said election, to be
given in accordance with law.
In testimony whereof, witness
the signatures of the President
and Secretary of said Eagle
Lake Independent School District
and the seal thereof hereunto
affixed this thirteenth day of Oc-
tober 1913.
