REPORTS INDICATE A HEAVY LOSS

Continued from page two

Douglass stated yesterday that it would be safe to say there will be no Sap trains to cross the bridge under two weeks. As soon as that road can get a pile driver in from the east the work of bridging that, damage will be commenced. The grade washed out at this point is too high to "erib" for temporary railroad service, and will have to be bridged, which will require at least two weeks' time before trains can cross over the river bridge.

Live Stock Lost in Flood.

While it will be some time before the extent of loss of live stock in the flood can be estimated, many have already reported the loss of horses, cattle and hogs. Mr. Stout Whitman lost three head of horses, a mule and a number of hogs. Mr. J. F. Beard lost four head of horses. He had been to the river pasture and gotten out there and put same in another pasture where it was known the water would not reach, but people going out to the river to view the high water left the gates open, these horses going back into the first named pasture and when the crest of the overflow came were drowned.

Southern Pacific From West. The first Southern Pacific train from the west since Thursday last week reached here Wednesday evening about 6:30 o'clock. This train was made up at Garden and brought no mail, no papers and few passengers. It went on to Rosenberg, and came back from there the following morning on No. 1's time, going on to San Antonio. No. 2, came from San Antonio at 3:30 p.m. today, being the first train from San Antonio in a week. It brought 150 copies of the San Antonio Express, which Agent John Harrington sold almost without leaving the station. On account of the S. P. track being badly washed near Sugarland, trains are not expected from Houston before Sunday at the earliest.

Today's Telephone News. At Wharton this Friday morning, the water has gone off of the banks, but does not yet back to its banks. Water still 31 or 4 feet at Santa Fe depot and between 2 and 3 feet in wholesale district. At crest of flood water was 21 feet deep over square.

500 Dead Near Hempstead. A special from Hempstead sent out Tuesday said: "The Brazos has fallen about 16 inches. Marks in the fall there show the river was 23 inches higher than the overflow of 1899. Benefit Show for Flood Victims.

The door receipts at the picture show last night, which was given for the benefit of the flood sufferers in the Eagle Lake district, after all expenses were deducted, amounted to \$30.30. This amount will go towards caring for those made destitute by the flood through the bottoms. The committee is doing all it can to relieve the situation. It will be several days before it can be told how much suffering among negroes there is in the bottoms. Hundreds of them "escaped with only their lives, losing their clothes and everything they possessed. Large amounts of clothing will be needed, just as soon as the negroes can get out of the bottoms. All old coats, hats, etc., will be accepted and put to good use. If you have any at home send it down now.

One Span of Bridge Gone. People are now able to get close enough to the Alair bridge to see that one span, the east span, of the county bridge is washed away. The bridge is otherwise greatly damaged.

Jack Battle's Body Not Found. A coffin went out yesterday for Jack Battle, but up to yesterday evening his body had not been found.

The Headlight had a number of photographs of the flood made, several of them being taken in the colored residence section when the back waters of the lake were at the highest, to have newspaper cuts made from them for publication in this issue. Had the trains operated between here and Houston, they would have been printed in this issue. The pictures went to the engraver on the last train that crossed over Brazos bridge. We have been advised by wire from Houston that the cuts have been made and are now in the express office awaiting the first train to open.

They will be here no doubt in a few days and, even though it will be a little late, they will be printed in next week's paper.
