

The first train out of Houston since the overflow reached Eagle Lake yesterday morning at 8:20 over the Southern Pacific. This was No. 9, which left Houston on time, at 11:20 Wednesday morning, but did not reach this place until Thursday morning, having lost about 18 hours while coming through the flooded district. The Southern Pacific on Wednesday resumed all train service. No east bound, due here at 5:05, arrived above two and a half hours late.

County Judge J. J. Mansfield, Mr. T. F. Boulden and Commissioners A. J. Ratcliff and Jno. Brod came down from Columbus yesterday evening and went out to inspect the Eagle Lake-Alfair bridge, one span of which and 775 feet of approach were washed out by the overflow. In speaking of the damaged bridges, Mr. T. F. Boulden stated this morning that it will take \$40,000 to put the three county bridges in repair. As the county has no funds on hand with which to make the repairs it is likely that a bond issue election for this work will be called at an early date.

The hookworm commission, under the direction in this county of Dr. Hubert Ferrell, having suspended work during the floods, will start work again Saturday, December 10th, at Eagle Lake, Tuesdays at Columbus, Wednesdays at Weimar, Thursdays at Garwood and Fridays at Rock Island. It is hoped that sufficient interest will be taken in the work, and a number of people will come out to be examined, especially the school children. The hookworm specialists are open for work in the Norris building every Saturday. The work in this county lost on account of the rains and overflows, will be made up by extending the work a week longer than advertised. There is no charge for this work, either examination or treatment.

Agent Frank Douglass of the Sap stated yesterday that his train merely have trains in from the west over the Altair bridge next week, but when the Sap will have a train out of Houston over its own line, Mr. Douglass was unable to say. Mr. Roberts' cottage near the school is likely to be detoured from here into Houston until our tracks are in repair.
