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Many people are crying "hard times" for the coming year on account of the flood. While the flood, in a way, is hard on the community, about the only people directly affected are the farmers, the large planters, especially, as the river bottoms, through which the flood went, are the most fertile damage, is made up of large farms and plantations. The owners of these farms and plantations are the ones that will suffer, for they are the ones that will have to take care of their tenants, and not the people at large. With the exception of the people at large, all crops had been gathered and disposed of, so when you look at the thing squarely in the face you will see that the large plantation owners are the ones who will lose by the flood. All fences will have to be repaired on their places and seed for the coming year and feed stuffs bought in many instances. But if every person in Eagle Lake will make an effort to pay his accounts regularly every month, and not take advantage of the flood situation to "stay off" his accounts, as some are already doing, who, in a financial way, the flood has not touched, times will not be so tight here during the year soon to be ushered in, and in a short time conditions will be normal here again.
