VOTERS WANT BALLOTS BURNED AFTER COUNT

Insist on City Primary Ballots Being Destroyed After Counting and Result Given Out.

With the coming into the field of a complete new ticket for city offices, a lively campaign will be the result. We have heard several people remark that they did not expect to vote in the city white man's primary because such a primary is not a legal election and things were not handled just in the manner in which they should be. That on previous occasions, it has been able to ascertain just how every man in town voted. The ballots in the city primary should be taken out and burned in the presence of the people just after the votes have been counted and the results given out by the judge of the election. On one occasion in the past, we recall to mind that the whole ballot box, with every ticket in it and the register list, showing how every man voted, was brought to the Headlight office. At that time, the Headlight sent the office boy out to get several empty cigar boxes for use in the office. He came in with several, including the ballot box with all the votes and tally sheets just as they had been voted. This box was not even sealed up. But this year there is going to be an effort made to have the primary conducted as it should be conducted—privately, and after the vote has been given out, burn the ballots in the presence of the people. There are many people in the town that do not care to make any person angry, still holding to that democratic principle that they have a right as a free born American citizen to vote.

City chairman J. A. Dromgoole, who has called the primary to convene on Tuesday, February 24th, will be in charge of this work, and we feel safe in saying, without first having seen him, that he will see to it that the ballots are all properly destroyed after the votes have been counted and the results given out. So this year, there will be no fear of any person finding out how you vote if you don't want people to know how you vote. And this is the proper manner in which a city white man's primary should be conducted.
