FRUIT AND CANNING CO. TAKES OUT CHARTER

The Eagle Lake Fruit and Canning Company has recently been chartered under the laws of the State of Texas, with a capital stock of \$2500, with O. G. Kolberg, A. E. Anderson and J. Penfold, as incorporators. Their preserving plant is located near the Eagle Lake Manufacturing Company's plant, where they have an ideal preserving plant, all preserves being cooked with steam. On account of the very unfavorable season last summer, which was the plant's first season in operation, they canned only figs but vegetables of all kinds. The company has a large fig acreage to draw from, and has contracted for the sale of their entire fig output for the next two years. These figs are

sold to a large firm in Chicago. The local plant will can the figs in five gallon cans which will be shipped in carload lots to the Chicago house, which in turn will preserve the figs and put them up in smaller packages for the retail trade.

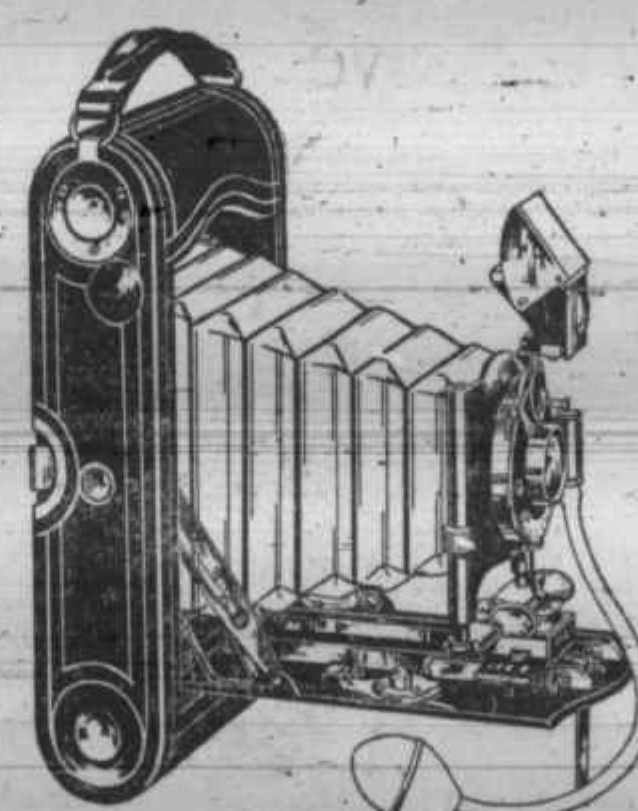
