CHURCHES HAD GOOD AUDIENCES SUNDAY.

Last Sunday, being Eagle Lake's first advertised "Church-Going Day," there was a noted increase in attendance at all the churches in the city. The Methodist church led in point of number, there being at the morning service at that church 175. The Baptists had the largest congregation in the evening, the number being 163. The Sunday attendance at the various churches was as follows: Methodist church, morning service, 175, evening service, 143; Baptist church, morning service, 148, evening service, 163; Christian church, morning service, 78, evening service, 86; Presbyterian church, morning service, 70, evening service, 55. Taking a total, there were 471 people at church in Eagle Lake in the morning, and 477 people at the evening services. Out of a population of 2,000 people, the total attendance is less than one-fifth of the people in town. People of Eagle Lake should get the habit of going to church. It is good for you. There is room in Eagle Lake for an increase in church attendance, and the people of the town, who are not themselves interested in church work, should take enough interest in matters pertaining to church affairs to encourage the church people in the good work they are doing for our town by at least their presence at some one of the churches in town on Sunday.

SALTING STATION CHANCES ARE GOOD

Mr. O. G. Kolberg who is interesting himself in the establishing of a salting station here says that our town will likely get it. He says the farmers and merchants give the project much encouragement. It might be interesting to know that the little neighboring town of Rock Island has had a salting station for three or four years. Two years ago, this salting station paid over \$7,000 to the farmers of that village. Last year was an off season but at that some of the farmers made good profit on cucumbers. On questioning prominent men there the information was given that 200 bushels per acre were frequently made, and that as high as 300 bushels per acre could be grown. However, saying that 100 bushels is a good average crop in fair season, per acre, the returns will be much better than the staple crops, corn and cotton. At Rock Island this year the pickling concern is contracting for cukes 2 to 5 inches long at 60c per bushel. An advantage of the cuke crop is that it brings money to the growers in mid summer, months before the cotton money comes in. It does not take much thought to see that this crop will be a big advantage to the farmers and the business interests of the town.

POLL TAX PAYMENTS LARGEST IN HISTORY

At an early hour this morning, Deputy City Tax Collector E. L. Mooney reported that, up until half past eight o'clock this morning, there had been 230 city poll taxes paid. Of this number about thirty colored people have paid. As we still have the remainder of today and tomorrow in which to pay poll taxes, it is expected that the number will be considerably increased. Last year there were in all 211 city poll taxes paid, being nine more than were paid two years ago. This year's payment of city poll taxes is the largest in the history of the incorporation. The voting strength of the Eagle Lake precinct box two years ago was 480. Last year the precinct poll tax payments fell off to 439, but this year it is believed that the precinct payments will reach considerably over the 500 mark. Weinar heretofore being the only precinct in the county to reach over the 500 payment.

FARMERS ARE WELL UP WITH THEIR PLOWING

The farmers are now about all well up with their work, and prospects for a good crop here are looking brighter. Land is in splendid shape and there is a better season in the ground than for many years. Quite a number of the potato men have been planting native seed the past ten days, and some of them have planted small acreages of Northern seed. As a rule, the planters are going to be a little careful and are going a little slow in planting Northern seed, as, on account of the failure in potatoes last season, they are taking no unnecessary chances in having their Northern potatoes killed back by late frosts. Some few of the farmers, however, are planting some Northern seed in order to take a chance in getting some real early potatoes on the market. The farmers are hopeful for a bumper crop this season, and it is believed that all of the potatoes raised, upon which the waters left a thick, rich deposit, will produce a big yield in potatoes, which will not only be a big crop, but will also be a big money crop.
