VINEYARD, WALKER & CO INTEREST LITIGATION

Supreme Court Rules That Bank-
rupts Must Pay Interest to
Creditors as Prayed For.

On Monday, February 2nd,
1914, the Supreme Court of the
United States rendered a deci-
sion denying the application for
certiorari filed by the bankrupts,
putting an end to the litigation
between the bankrupts and cer-
tain creditors of the estate of
Vineyard, Walker & Co., over
the payment of interest on the
claims of these creditors after
the date of the adjudication in
bankruptcy.

This litigation began on the
28th day of March, 1910, when
the trustees filed their final re-
port and asked to be permitted
to pay the claims of the credi-
tors to the bankrupts. Certain cre-
ditors of the estate filed opposi-
tion to this application, claiming
interest on their claims up to
the date of the payment.

On March 30th the referee in
bankruptcy rendered a decision
depriving the creditors their in-
terest. Later, the matter was
carried before Judge Waller T.
Burns of the district court, and
in a decision rendered by him on
the 30th of May, the district
judge sustained the referee and
denied the creditors their inter-
est. The creditors then carried
the matter to the United States
Circuit Court of Appeals at New
Orleans and that court held that
the creditors were entitled to
their interest, reversing the de-
cision of Judge Burns. The
bankrupts and trustees took an
appeal to the Supreme Court of
the United States and in addi-
tion to the writ of certiorari to re-
view the decision of the Circuit
Court of Appeals.

On January 19, 1914, the Su-
preme Court sustained the credi-
tors' motion to dismiss the ap-
peal for want of jurisdiction and
on the 2nd day of February, it
denied the application for cer-
tiopari.

This puts an end to the litiga-
tion and means that the credi-
tors will get their interest as
prayed for.

This has been a long drawn
out fight and one in which a
great deal of local interest has
been taken around Eagle Lake.
This case for the creditors was
fought through the courts by
Ring, Carothers & Brown. The
opposing counsel in the case were
T. M. Kennedy, C. A. Warden,
R. G. Maury and Lane, Wolters
& Storey.
