CITY PRIMARY BALLOTS WILL BE DESTROYED

Chairman Dromgoole Says No One Will Find Out How Any Person Casts His Vote.

Chairman J. A. Dromgoole of the city white man's party, says that one need not fear at this election that any person will find out how any other person votes. The ballots he says will be properly taken care of after they have been voted, and no one will have access to the ballot box. There are many people who do not care to make any person angry by casting their vote against that person, but in an election a voter can vote for but one candidate when there are more than one in the race, so, according to the chairman, every person will have an opportunity to vote as he pleases and no other person will be in a position to find out how he votes. We commend Mr. Dromgoole for this move, as it is only as a primary election should be conducted. The polls will be opened promptly at 8 o'clock a. m. and remain open until 7 o'clock in the evening. It has been rumored that the polls will close at six o'clock, but this will not be the case. According to the election laws, the polls must be kept open until seven o'clock. The primary election next Tuesday will be conducted strictly according to law, therefore giving each candidate a "square deal." Should the polls close at six o'clock, there would be some people who would not have an opportunity to vote, as they will not be able to leave their work until six o'clock. GRAND JURY MAKES REPORT TO JUDGE

Makes Regular Report to District Judge and Says Crime in the County is on Decrease.

To the Hon. M. Kennon, judge of the district court of Colorado county, Texas:

The grand jury impaneled by your honor at the February term of the district court respectfully submit the following to your honor in concluding their labors as such body.

We have diligently inquired into all violations of the law, both felonies and misdemeanors, which have come to our knowledge, and while we have investigated quite a number of supposed violations of the law, we have returned only six bills for felony violations and seven for misdemeanors, which we think we were justified in doing in accordance with our oath and your honor's charge. In this connection we are glad to report that from our investigations crime is greatly on the decrease in our county.

The grand jury has not had the time, and is of the opinion that it would have been a useless consumption of both time and money, to have made or attempted an investigation of the financial condition of the county, nor do we think any benefit could or would be derived from the appointment of a finance committee by your honor.

We have visited and inspected the county farm; jail, courthouse and the two bridges spanning the river at Columbus. We can truthfully say that we found the buildings at the county farm in

clean and sanitary condition, the convicts, paupers and lunatics being well taken care of so far as we were able to ascertain from appearances and talking with said inmates. They appeared to be well clothed, housed and fed, and we found them upon our visit as comfortably situated as the circumstances would require.

The jail and the courthouse are in fairly good condition and are as well kept, so far as cleanliness is concerned, as any public building of a like character we have seen. We would, however, suggest to the commissioners' court of this county that they give special attention to the toilets in the courthouse, as some of them are entirely out of commission.

We find that the east bridge has been temporarily repaired and is in a very fair condition and perfectly safe for general travel. The north bridge has not yet been repaired and we are informed that the reason of this is a lack of funds on the part of the county. We would respectfully suggest to the commissioners' court, that on account of the changing of the channel of the bed of the river by the recent flood at the present location of said bridge, and the probability of its further changing and causing further bridging, a competent bridge engineer be employed to make examinations and surveys to the extent of a mile above and below the present bridge, and if a better location can be found to make an estimate of the cost of taking down said bridge and reconstructing the same at the new location, together with buying right-of-way to said new location; and also the cost of repairing said bridge as it stands.
