It is rumored that the commissioners court contemplate early work to reconstruct that part of the bridge destroyed by the flood.

CAREY DEFENDS PRESENT CITY ADMINISTRATION; SAYS THEY ARE NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR THE INCREASED TAX RATE.

As I am the only member of present city council who is standing for re-election, and in view of the fact that it has been said of us that we are or have been an extravagant administration, I wish to give the voters a few "truthful facts" about the last two years of the government of our city and then leave it to the unprejudiced and liberal minded tax payer if we have not done the best we could for the interest of our city under the existing circumstances. I wish to show that we have also done more in substantial improvements, with less money to do it with, than any other administration of the city in the same level of time.

We assumed the government of Eagle Lake in April, 1912, and half the town and put in about twenty-five culverts, and we expected to, by April first, have the whole city ditched so that the water will not run into people's yards every time we have a rain. We will not be owing anything when we turn over the reins of government to the incoming administration in April, and have on hand between \$3,000 and \$4,000 to the credit of the city, and it is clear to my mind that if the same economical, conservative management of the city's affairs are maintained by the incoming administration that has been practiced by the present one, that the taxes can be materially lowered, and still present improvements go on.

These are plain, simple facts that the city records will bear out and every man on the council is proud of the record we have made, and we are willing to stand up for everything we have done, but do not think we should be blamed for things we are not responsible for.

I ask the voters to give these facts due consideration, as we have weathered the storm and passed the breakers and now the next administration will have easy sailing.—H. E. Carey.
