MAYORATLY CANDIDATES ARE ON HOME STRETCH

Candidates on Last Lap in Mayorally Sweepstakes Race—All Four Coming Under Wire.

The candidates are now in the home stretch of one of the most exciting local campaigns ever experienced in Eagle Lake. The campaign has been fought on a "square" and "square" and we are glad to state, without any "mud-slinging." It has been anticipated that some of the candidates would get "cold feet," ere the "battle of the ballots" and withdraw from the race, but from present indications, it seems that all four candidates are going to run the race to the full limit. Each of the four candidates in the mayorality race expresses confidence in his election. The marshal's race will also be close and interesting, although you can hear but few expressions on that contest. Nothing but a full count of the votes can give any light as to its outcome. The excitement in the mayor's race seems to have made the marshal's campaign take a back seat. The election will be held in the city council rooms next Tuesday, and according to law, the polls should be opened promptly at eight o'clock. Should the polls not be opened promptly at 8 o'clock, there would remain grounds on which the election could be contested.

Chairman J. A. Dromgoole of the city white man's party will see to it that all ballots are secretly cared for, and that no one will be given an opportunity to find out how any man has voted. After the ballots have been counted and the results given out, the judge of the election will turn over the ballot box, sealed by the election judges, to the chairman, who will deposit same in a safety deposit box at one of the banks, the chairman retaining the key. These ballots will remain in this safety deposit box until after the regular city election in April, at which time they will be taken out by the chairman and burned publicly in the presence of the people. This is as it should be. Every voter will thus be given an opportunity to vote his convictions without another living soul finding out how he votes.

Much interest is centered in the coming election, and the friends of each candidate are claiming victory, though supporters of each candidate in the mayorality race are willing to concede that no candidate has a "clinch" and the result is going to be entirely too close to be comfortable. GIVES MIDNIGHT ALARM

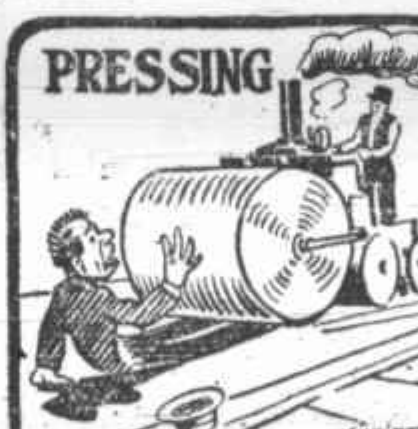
