Twelve Men Indorse One Dollar Check and It Works All Day

A \$1 check was deposited with a Fort Worth bank recently upon the same day it was written and it had been indorsed by twelve men, ten of whom were known to the cashier, says the Texas Banker's Journal.

The check was signed by a physician, indorsed by a wood dealer, dentist, office girl, two clothing merchants, confectioner, grocery man, negro loan company, poor woman, and was deposited by a florist.

The cashier, who is a talkative as well as imaginative man in speaking of the check said: "The physician must have bought a load of wood and the wood man either had a tooth yanked or paid a dentist bill he had been standing off for several months."
