SKATERS AND BICYCLE RIDERS MUST OBEY LAW.

Skating on the sidewalks

throughout the residence part of

the city by the small boys and

girls of the town has gotten to be

such a nuisance, that a stop

should be put to the practice and

that at once. How the nuisance

has been allowed to continue this

long is more than we can under-

stand, when there is an ordinance

on the city's books against it,

making it a finable offense to

skate on the sidewalks or to ride

bicycles on the sidewalks. Take

a walk through the residence por-

tion of town late in the evening or

after night, and if you don't get

off of the sidewalk for the skat-

ers, you'll be knocked off. We

recall to mind that during the

past two weeks two ladies of the

city have been run into and knock-

ed off the sidewalks. One by some

skating on the sidewalk, and the

other by a bicycle ridden on the

sidewalk. The practice of skat-

ing and bicycle riding on the side-

walks is being carried to such an

extreme that the skaters and rid-

ers make no attempt to give the

sidewalk to pedestrians. The

skaters will come by you in great

droves, giving an oral "honk,

honk," and if you don't vacate

the sidewalks for them, then you

can take the consequences. We

are not in any way opposed to the

children of the town enjoying

themselves in every way possible,

but the sidewalks were made for

the people to walk on, and not for

the children to skate on. If this

ordinance, made especially to pre-

vent skating and riding bicycles

on the sidewalk, is not going to be

enforced, then the city should re-

peal the ordinance. This nu-

isance has reached such a point

that it demands immediate action

by the city, and the proper au-

thorities should look into the mat-

ter. It is dangerous for people

to walk on the sidewalks through

the residence part of town after

night, and some action should be

taken by the city before some

person is seriously injured.
