EAGLE LAKE SHOULD HAVE CLEANUP DAY

The city council in nearly every small city in the state is making a vigorous effort to bring about a general cleanup campaign. Such a thing in Eagle Lake just at this time, before the long, hot summer gets here, would not be amiss. Why can't Eagle Lake have a general clean up week, but just a clean up week unless it is properly carried out and properly looked after will not amount to much. If the people of our city can be interested in this important matter, and have overseers appointed to look after the work during the clean up, it will be a great thing for the health as well as the general appearance of the city.

Election Proclamation.

By virtue of authority vested in me as Mayor of the city of Eagle Lake, Texas, hereby order an election to be held in and for the City of Eagle Lake, Tex. on the first Tuesday of April A. D. 1914, same being the 7th day of said month, for the purpose of electing one Mayor to succeed P. P. Putney, one Marshal to succeed N. W. Callison and two Aldermen to succeed W. E. Lenhart and H. E. Carey, for the ensuing two years.

Said election to be held at the City Council room in the Norris building in said city and to be conducted in strict conformity with the election laws of the State of Texas.

I hereby nominate and appoint W. E. Davis as presiding officer of said election, giving and empowering him with full authority to select two judges and two clerks to help hold said election.
