NEED SCHOOL HOUSE

Colored School and Hall at Elm Grove Believed to Have Been Burned by Incendiarists

The colored public school house and hall at Elm Grove, just below Mr. P. P. Hebert's place in Wharton county, was totally destroyed by fire last Friday night. This building was erected about twelve months ago by the members of the colored K. P. Lodge and Farmers' Improvement Society. The cost of erection was about \$1200, all of which had been paid with the exception of a small amount. The fire is believed to have been of incendiary origin, and the flames originated on the south side of the building. From best accounts there seems to have been a split among those in control of the hall and school house, and we are told that remarks to the effect that certain lodge meetings which were to be held next week, would never be held in that hall. This is the school in which W. J. McCann, one of the best known colored school teachers in this section, is employed. He informs the Headlight that they were just about to inaugurate a domestic science department in the school and had every promise of success. He says they are going ahead with their school work in temporary quarters and that they will still inaugurate the domestic science departments. There was no insurance on the building, and the Wharton county officers are investigating.

SOLDIER ASLEEP FALLS FROM A MOVING TRAIN

Crawls Out of Car Window While Sleep But Had No Trouble in Awakening When He Hit

Several train loads of United States soldiers passed through here on the Southern Pacific last Friday and Friday night, en route to the border counties. One of the soldiers, George Hobson, a private, whose home is in North Carolina, fell from one of the trains near Ramsey's Point, six miles west of here, and was badly injured. He crawled out of a window in his sleep, while the train was under full speed. Three of his toes on one foot were almost torn off, the other foot was badly bruised and torn, and he was painfully bruised all over his body, though none of his injuries were serious.

Flourish nominate and appoint W. E. Davis as presiding officer of said election, giving and empowering him with full authority to select two judges and two clerks to help hold said election.
