SAD DEATH OF BEAUTIFUL YOUNG GIRL AT CALHOUN

Miss Florence Terrell Died at Home of Uncle at Calhoun—Funeral in Missouri.

Our community was grieved on last Sunday morning to learn of the death of Miss Florence Terrell, which occurred on Saturday night, at the home of her uncle, Mr. T. W. Terrell, at Calhoun.

Miss Florence was a beautiful girl just in her twentieth year, and was one of the most amiable young women of our acquaintance, and has made a wide circle of friends during her three years' residence in this section.

She has never been in the best of health, and at the death of her father some three years ago in Missouri, came here to reside with her uncle, and thinking the change of climate might restore her to health. For a time she seemed to improve, but for the past year has been in failing health, and for the last three weeks has been in a critical condition, her death being expected at most any minute.

She is a niece of Messrs I. W. C. W. and J. M. Terrell, her mother and father having preceded her in death before she came to Texas to reside with her uncles. The body was brought to Eagle Lake Monday and taken to the home of Mr. J. M. Terrell in this city, where services were held at two o'clock in the afternoon, Rev. Samuel G. Porter, the Episcopal rector officiating, she having been a member of the Episcopal church since early childhood.

Her brother, Mr. Chas. Terrell, of Washington, D. C., who was called here on account of her serious illness, accompanied the remains to Marshall, Missouri, the old home, for interment. Another brother, Mr. Hugh Terrell, of Indianapolis, Indiana, also attended the funeral at Marshall. The Headlight extends its sincerest sympathy to the sorrowing relatives in their deep grief.

Leave Eagle Lake at 7:30 a. m. arriving at Chesterville at 8:00 a. m. Leave Chesterville at 9:00 a. m. and arrive at Lissie at 9:30. Leave Lissie at 10:30 a. m. and arrive at East Bernard at 11:30 a. m. Leave East Bernard at 2:00 p. m. and arrive at Wallis at 3 p. m. Leave Wallis at 4 p. m. for Eagle Lake.

Third day's trip—May 27th. Leave Eagle Lake at 7:30 a. m. arriving at Alleyton at 8:30 a. m. Leave Alleyton at 9 a. m. and arrive at Mentz at 10:00 a. m. Leave Mentz at 11 a. m. and arrive at Bernardo at 12 M. Leave Bernardo at 4 p. m. for Eagle Lake.
