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Use Convicts To Build Roads.

Over in the Lindale precinct of Smith county forty-eight state convicts are building public roads. The convicts were taken from the penitentiary and put on the work of making sand-clay roads. There is no guard over the convicts, neither is there a gun in camp, and the men wear citizens' clothes. The men are reported as enjoying life and doing a splendid work. This is an experiment, and it may prove the solution of two difficult problems—that of building roads and making penitentiaries self-sustaining. Texas needs roads; and possibly the state can furnish good labor to make them at a low price. Texas penitentiaries have proved a burden to the people—possibly they can be made to yield a small profit while the convicts perform a useful work. And the reports of the men of the country of the men are such as to make all the people glad. Possibly convicts can be placed on their honor with safety; if so we shall hear no more of the brutal outrages upon the inmates of our penitentiaries—outrages that shock our very being and make our souls sick. —Honey Grove Signal.

PRAIRIE POTATO CROP LOOKING SPLENDIDLY

Next Season May See Potato Crop In Connection With Many Rice Farms on Prairie.

The writer, in company with Messrs. Frank, Fox and Hayes Stephens and W. A. Moore, had the pleasure of a drive out to the Stephens farm on the prairie in the Stephens car. On this farm the Messrs. Stephens have in fifty acres of potatoes. This crop is being cultivated by Messrs. Gus, Ernest and Helmer Scholm, and is being put in by the Messrs. Stephens as an experiment. The stand of spuds on the fifty acres is almost perfect and the potatoes are looking as fine as any we have seen in the bottoms. This is the first time potatoes have been tried on prairie land. The Messrs. Stephens have everything in shape to irrigate this crop from their rice well, should the potatoes need water. From present indications the prairie crop of potatoes is very promising and will be watched with a great deal of interest by the people of this section. Should the experiment prove a success, next season will no doubt see a potato crop in connection with a great many of the rice farms on the prairie, which will mean a big thing for this country. The water for the potatoes would be used and the potatoes harvested almost before irrigation is needed for the rice crop, and the money for that crop would be in the hands of the farmer long before he began to think of harvesting his rice crop.

Dr. Wiley Says Eat Oranges.
Doctor Harvey W. Wiley, former Chief of the Bureau of Chemistry of the Department of Agriculture, and universally admitted to be one of the greatest authorities on pure foods and dietetics in the world, says: "Eat oranges and lemons."

In an interview, Dr. Wiley says: "Oranges are excellent for people. It is good to eat oranges for breakfast, and also dinner—not from a medical, but an anti-medical standpoint. Both oranges and lemons ought to be used as freely as the financial ability of the consumer may permit. A laboring man may not be able always to eat oranges at breakfast, yet the fruit is usually very cheap and the consumption of it will obviate the need of physic, and save many a doctor's bill. Note that I do not say 'eat an orange for breakfast,' but 'eat oranges.'"

Even if in strained circumstances, people should eat plenty of oranges and lemons, not only in the summer time, but all the time. I don't think anything I have ever said in praise of a fruit diet is too strong to say about oranges and lemons.
