COLORADO RIVER FISHING IS GOOD NEAR COLUMBUS

Columbus, Texas, April 7.

Spring is opening up here in fine shape. It is putting everybody to work, from the farmers to the fishermen. Trot lines, throw lines and drop lines may be seen all along the river banks and some fine fish are being caught every day or so within one block of the court house. Columbus is situated on the banks of the Colorado.

Many spring gardens are being planted. The people here are not allowing any season of the year go by without good gardens.

All winter long in every family in the community has had fresh vegetables that were raised in or near Columbus. One farmer who lived a few miles from town has sold about \$15 worth of cabbage along during the last 30 days and has gathered only about a fourth of his crop. He has nearly an acre of ground in his garden. The vegetables are well flavored and firm, many of the cabbage weighing 10 or 12 pounds.

Commissioners' Court Order.

It is ordered by the Court that an election of the qualified property tax paying voters of Colorado County be held on Tuesday May 12th, 1914, to determine whether or not an additional Road Tax shall be levied for the further maintenance of the Public Roads, said Tax not to exceed five cents on the One Hundred Dollars Valuation of taxable property of said county; and the County Judge is ordered to give notice of said election as provided by law. All voters favoring said tax shall have written or printed upon their ballots the words, "For The Tax," and those opposing, the words, "Against The Tax."
