



POTATO CROP IS NOW IN NEED OF GOOD RAIN

Spud Crop is Needing Rain and
Indications Today For Rain
Are Very Encouraging.

Potatoes are needing rain. The high winds that we have been having have dried out the land rapidly, and the potato crop is now needing rain badly, and unless we have it in a few days the crop will begin to suffer. Potatoes have not been doing at all well lately, due to the cold weather, the high winds and now the drouth that is coming on them. A good many of the vines of the northern seed, are not showing a good, healthy green color, but are beginning to yellow to some extent. Some of the potato men say this is due to the cold weather and not to the want of rain. The spuds have not yet begun to suffer for the lack of rain, but that crop has gone just about as far as it can go without suffering unless rain falls within a few days. The prospect is mighty fine for a potato crop, but it will take a good soaking rain to make it, and unless a rain comes pretty soon the yield is going to be cut short again this year. There never was a better outlook for a good spud crop than now, and another ten days' drouth will blast the hopes of the potato men, and cut the yield down to about half a crop. But the farmers are hopeful. They are hoping that a good rain will fall over the potato section within the next few days.

THE PANTATORIUM.

To the Citizens of Colorado County:

Concerning my candidacy for Representative of the 71st District, composed of Austin and Colorado counties, I desire to make the following remarks: About two years ago my friends requested me to announce for the Legislature, and were about to petition me to that effect. I requested them not to do so, for I had received a letter from my friend, Mr. Geo. Herder of Weimer, stating he was going to announce for the place. I immediately promised him my support. Since Mr. Herder will not be a candidate this term, who, if he had announced, I doubt would have had any opposition. The proposition now becomes an original one, and I really think it is now Austin county's turn. I further feel, in the event an Austin county man receives the nomination, he would be entitled to a second term; should he however refuse to offer again, as in the case of Mr. Herder, then Colorado county should have the right to name a man.

I favor the employment of State and County convicts on the public roads, believe that the State will save money and the counties will profit thereby.

I favor the building up of the Rural Public Free Schools, to the highest state of efficiency, so that there will be a universal awakening to the existing evils

and a people of this great Democratic Government will be able to apply the necessary remedies. This government is one of the people and its maintenance devolves on us and future generations. The keeper and preserver of such Government must be equal to the task.

I believe a more practical method of judicial procedure should be adopted. Under the present system the long confinement of criminals in our jails entails a heavy expense on our counties, which could probably be avoided.

In conclusion I wish to state my general policy will be one of conservatism. I will use my best efforts to serve the people of Colorado and Austin counties fairly and impartially.
