IRRIGATING POTATOES ON STEPHENS FARM

Water Turned Down Potato Rows From Rice Canal on Stephens Prairie Potato Farm.

The potato crop of the Frank Stephens Company, on the prairie about three miles from Eagle Lake, is being irrigated this week. This is the first time that potatoes have ever been irrigated in this section, and the first time that a field of such acreage—fifty acres—has ever been tried here on prairie land. The irrigating is being done from the Stephens rice well, the land on which the potatoes are growing having been planted in rice last year. The stand of potatoes on this fifty acres is almost perfect—the finest stand we have seen in this section this season. This land was well fertilized, one thousand pounds of commercial fertilizer to the acre having been used. The plants are well set with potatoes, in fact heavier than any we have seen in the bottoms. Every vine will average eight and ten potatoes now as large as quail eggs, and some of the hills have many as eighteen potatoes of this size. Water is being turned from the canal down the rows, watering from ten to twelve rows at a time. At this rate about fifteen acres a day were irrigated. It is believed, from the size of the potatoes on the vines, that even without any more rain, this crop will not need but one more good watering. It is estimated that

PAYMENT OF OLD FINES URGED BY CITY COUNCIL

"Business on Business Principles," City's Motto in Future Says Mayor and Councilmen.

The city council met in regular session Tuesday morning, which was the council's first meeting in the firemen's hall, which will be the regular place of meeting in the future. Mayor E. L. Mooney and all five of the aldermen were present. H. S. Vineyard was duly qualified and sworn in as city marshal of Eagle Lake on last Saturday morning, April 11th. Mr. John Matthews being present at this meeting was duly qualified and sworn in as alderman. Mayor Mooney made the following appointments for the ensuing year: H. E. Carey, mayor pro tem. H. E. Carey and W. T. Chester, street committee. A. J. Wirtz and C. H. Brosig, street committee. John Matthews and C. H. Brosig water and light committee. A. J. Wirtz and W. T. Chester, auditing committee. Motion was made and carried and W. E. Lenhart was appointed city treasurer for the ensuing year. Motion was made and carried and John Harrington received the appointment as city fire marshal for the year. Motion was made and carried that all city officers, including city marshal, city attorney, fire marshal, tax collector and assessor and street commissioner, shall meet with the city council at every regular meeting. The time of the council meeting was changed from 10:00 a. m. to 8:00 p. m. The council issued instructions that the street commissioner and city marshal work together in the collection of street taxes. The council dwelt on this matter for some time, taking up the fact that so many people subject to road taxes here are not in the habit of paying same. It was decided at this meeting that every person subject to a street tax is going to pay it this year or the council is going to know the reason why. Complaints will be promptly filed against all persons who fail to pay this tax. It was shown in the council meeting that a number of unpaid fines were due the city. On some of these cases the costs have been collected but the fines to the city have not been paid. As the fine to the city always comes ahead against any other costs in the matter, motion was made and carried that, in all cases reported by the auditing committee, in
