CRUSE SAYS POTATOES WILL MAKE BIG YIELD

Mr. J. T. Cruse, who is rapidly becoming known as one of our "potato kings," was a pleasant caller at our office Wednesday. He says the potato crop is doing splendidly and since the rain last Saturday, the potatoes in the hills have almost doubled in size. He says while the northern seed are going to produce a big yield this year, the native seed are going to produce the really bumper crops. "On eighteen acres of native seed this year, I firmly believe I will make more potatoes than I did on fifty-five acres of northern seed last year," said Mr. Cruse, "and besides, the natives this year are going to be pretty nearly as early as the northern."

YIELD WILL BE LARGE AND QUALITY OF SPUDS FINE

Biggest Yield and Best Stock We Have Ever Grown Here Say the Potato Planters.

Messrs. John and Joe Helmer were in the city yesterday from their plantation. Mr. Helmer left home before the rain of yesterday morning and stated, at that time, that his potatoes had not been injured by too much rain but that the fields had just about all the water they could stand. He says he expects to begin digging about the 18th, which will be about one week later than last year. Mr. Helmer says if the rain stops now and the weather turns off pretty and warm, in his opinion, this section of the country will ship the biggest crop, and the best grade of potatoes during the six years he has been growing potatoes here. "The crop will not only be big, but the potatoes are going to be large and fine. After the vines begin to die back and turn yellow is when the potato gets its real growth," said Mr. Helmer, "and unless the planters wait for that growth, their potatoes will be just about half the size they would have been. I never saw vines grow so rank, and all of this growth" should go back into the potato to properly mature them. Potatoes almost double in size during the last few days before proper digging time." Mr. Helmer says he believes digging through this territory will last as late as the fifteenth of June.
