## ONLY TWO CASES OF SMALLPOX AT CAMP

All Patients Recovered and Turned Loose From the Detention Camp Except Two.

"If some more cases of smallpox do not develop shortly the city health officer is going to be out of a job," remarked City Health officer J. K. Davidson yesterday.

Three patients were released from the detention camp last Saturday and three more at intervals during the week, leaving but two cases at the camp now, and Dr. Davidson states that both of them are able to walk about the camp and are well on the road to recovery. Dr. Davidson says that the time limit for contracting the disease is up for all who were in any way exposed to smallpox on the camp grounds. Soon as the remaining two patients at the camp are turned loose, there will be no more cases in the city. The smallpox situation has been well handled in Eagle Lake, and what looked at one time was going to become an epidemic has been practically entirely stamped out, owing to the good judgment and proper treatment by the city health officer. There seems to be no more uneasiness now among any of the people, and conditions concerning the smallpox situation in Eagle Lake have become normal again.
